

2009 Annexation of SW 20th Ave Area

In Nov. 2008 voters (1,260 Yes - 666 No) elected to annex into City adding approximately 6,402 in population and 660 acres.





City/County Inter-local Agreement for transition of services after annexation

- Made and entered into March 13, 2007
- Acknowledges the City and County responsibility for the provision of fire services within their jurisdictional boundaries
- Recognizes the need for the smooth an proper transition of services and capital projects between the City and County



Transfer of Other Services

County services transition to the City:

- Immediate: Law Enforcement
- Shorter: Building Permits, Codes, etc.
- Longer: Fire Rescue Services, Parks



GFR Currently Provides these Fire Rescue Services in annexed area

- Fire Inspections
- Fire investigations
- Public Education
- Multi-Unit Responses
- Squad 2 Response (June 2014)



Transition Discussions with Alachua County

Discussions were held between GFR and ACFR and Manager's staff on transitioning services;

- County Commission declined to sell Station 19.
- County Commission voted-down a temporary "no-charge" amendment to FSAA agreement.
- City Commission approved Squad-2 and SAFER
 Grant.




Transition of Services GFR providing EMS Response

- Moving to Canopy Complex August 2015




Geographic Response Density




Net FSAA Reimbursement Trend



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
City Expense for FSAA (E19)



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


FSAA History and Transition of Services

Longer Term Planning for Fire Service Delivery

June 19, 2014 – Commission direction (7-0) to "...develop plans to build a new city fire station in the station 19 service area":

- Station Location and Deployment Study
- Develop concepts for temporary station
- CIP Request for Station 9 in FY17-21 plan



Temporary Police/Fire Station Concept

- Temporary Modular Building
- Located in SW area
- Shared by GFR and GPD

Benefits:

- Public access and visibility
- Engine Company capable
- Police and Fire Training,
 Shift Meetings
- Increased Public Safety services

Challenges:

- Locating Site
- Zoning
- Cost



Recommendation

The City Commission:

- 1. Hear an update on the transition of Fire-Rescue services in Southwest Gainesville;
- Direct staff to provide options for a temporary modular GFR/GPD station in Southwest Gainesville;
- 3. Approve \$50,000 from the General Fund fund balance for a fire station location and deployment study; and
- 4. Direct Staff to prepare a CIP request for GFR Station 9 (SW area) to be placed in the FY17-21CIP.
