Steve Phillips, Director of Parks, Recreation and Cultural Affairs, introduced this agenda item explaining that before the half cent sales tax was approved, we were required to outline the different projects we were proposing to use the funds for (land acquisition, park development and park improvements). A list with 23 projects was generated and prioritized. Funds for the Wild Spaces Public Places capital projects were allocated based on the implementation plan approved by the City Commission. Jobs were created in Gainesville and many local contractors were hired to complete the work on these projects impacting the local economy.
