4	An ordinance of the City of Gainesville, Florida, amending the			
5	City of Gainesville Code of Ordinances, relating to the serving			
6	of alcohol at non-profit events at the Thomas Center and			
7	Thelma Boltin Center by amending section 4-4, Consumption,			
8 9	sale and consumption, possession generally, to permit serving alcoholic beverages during fundraising events by non-profit			
10	agencies at the Thomas Center and Thelma Boltin Center;			
11	providing directions to the codifier; providing a severability			
12	clause; providing a repealing clause; and providing an			
13	immediate effective date.			
14				
15	WHEREAS, at least 10 days notice has been given once by publication in a newspaper			
16	of general circulation notifying the public of this proposed ordinance and of a public hearing to			
17	be held in the City Commission Auditorium, City Hall, City of Gainesville; and			
18	WHEREAS, the Public Hearings were held pursuant to the published notice			
19	described at which hearings the parties in interest and all others had an opportunity to be and			
20	were, in fact, heard.			
21	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF			
22	THE CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA:			
23	Section 1. Section 4-4, Gainesville Code of Ordinances, is amended			
24	to read as follows:			
25 26	Sec. 4-4. Consumption, sale and consumption, possession generally			
26 27	(a) Parks, similar areas. It shall be unlawful for any person to consume or to have in			
28	his/her possession any alcoholic beverages in a publicly owned park or recreation area, or on			
29	any public school property, or at any municipally owned and operated recreation centers or			
30	swimming pools, or at the stadium located near Waldo Road, commonly known as Citizens			

1	Field. The foregoing prohibitions shall not apply in the following areas on the occasions			
2	stated as to any type of alcoholic beverage:			
3	(1) The airport terminal facility when being dispensed by a person duly licensed			
4	under the ordinances of the city and the statutes of the state;			
5	(2) The Thomas Center, the Thelma Bolton Center and Boulware Springs, upon			
6	approval of the city manager or designee for consumption, not sale, of alcoholic			
7	beverages;			
8	(3) The Thomas Center and the Thelma Bolton Center, upon approval of the city			
9	manager or designee, for consumption only of alcohol alcoholic beverages on the			
10	premises associated with a fundraising event sponsored by a governmental or not-for-			
11	profit entity that charges admission for entry to the event. The approval pursuant to			
12	this subsection is subject to the following conditions:			
13	a. Sponsor obtains a facility use agreement from the city.			
14	b. Sponsor must obtain a temporary liquor license and otherwise comply			
15	with Florida's alcoholic beverage law.			
16	(34) The municipal golf course facility when being dispensed by a person duly			
17	licensed under applicable ordinances and state statutes;			
18	(4 <u>5</u>) The Downtown Plaza, upon approval of the city manager or designee for			
19	consumption on the premises, or sale and consumption on the premises, of alcoholic			
20	beverages associated with a special event. Sale and consumption of alcoholic			
21	beverages shall be limited to beer and wine, and permitted by the city manager or			
22	designee only under the following conditions:			

1	a. The special event shall be produced by the city. The city manager or
2	designee shall select an organization qualified under section 501(c)(3) of the
3	Internal Revenue Code and registered pursuant to F.S. Ch. 496 to sell
4	alcoholic beverages at a designated location or locations on the Plaza.
5	Selection of the nonprofit organization and sales of beer and wine shall be
6	pursuant to policy developed by the city manager.
7	b. The nonprofit organization and persons responsible for the sale or
8	dispensing of the alcoholic beverages shall comply with all local, state and
9	federal laws related to the sale, dispensing and consumption of alcoholic
10	beverages, including, but not limited to, procuring a license to sell alcoholic
11	beverages from the state.
12	c. All sales of alcohol shall take place during the event as specified by
13	the city manager or designee, and only between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and
14	11:00 p.m. on Friday and Saturday, 1:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. on Sunday, 9:00
15	a.m. New Year's Eve and 1:00 a.m. New Year's Day, and 9:00 a.m. and 10:00
16	p.m. on any other day.
17	d. The organization and persons responsible for the sale or dispensing of
18	the alcoholic beverages shall stop such sale or dispensing upon determination
19	of the city manager or designee that continued sale and consumption of
20	alcohol creates a clear and present danger of a riot or other general public
21	disorder, and substantial injury to persons or to property.
22	e. The organization shall indemnify the city, its elected and appointed
23	officers, employees, agents, and attorneys from any claim for personal injury,

1	including death, or property damage, including destruction, associated with		
2	the special event. This indemnification shall be in the form of an insurance		
3	policy that names the city as an additional insured and is endorsed to provide		
4	separate aggregate of \$1,000,000.00 for the event for which the person or		
5	organization is making application.		
6	f. The organization shall present an accounting of the revenues and cost		
7	of sales of alcohol to the city manager or designee within ten days after the		
8	event. The city shall charge the organization for the cost of the event in excess		
9	of the cost the city would have incurred if no alcohol was sold (for example,		
10	the cost of extra police or signs).		
11	Section 2. It is the intention of the City Commission that the provisions of		
12	Section 1 shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of		
13	Gainesville, Florida, and that the Sections and Paragraphs of this Ordinance may be		
14	renumbered or relettered in order to accomplish such intentions.		
15	Section 3. If any word, phrase, clause, paragraph, section or provision of this		
16	ordinance or the application hereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid or		
17	unconstitutional, such finding shall not affect the other provisions or applications of the		
18	ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid or unconstitutional provisions or		
19	application, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are declared severable.		
20	Section 4. All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, in conflict herewith are to the		
21	extent of such conflict hereby repealed.		
22	Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon adoption.
