City Commission Priority Changes as of July 14, 2008

gree to remove the most populous municipality provision from the BAA and instead state that it is the duty of the Alachua County Commission to perform this function

ban services reports be required for annexations of a certain size, relative to the size of the municipality; and that the thresholds be negotiated, and that submittal to the County be for informational purposes only

There be a similar report prepared for those properties that might be in conservation usage that might be annexed

The County Commission retain its role in setting urban reserve areas, and should there be any other body that performs this function in lieu of the County Commission, it should be structured in such a manner of "one person, one vote"

eave the number of years in which services should be provided at 10 years

Ver the Florida Statute Section 171.046 (2) (a), authorize adding the language to ection A of that section which is to annex an enclave of 10 acres or less by interlocal agreement, with the County having jurisdiction of the enclave

we the City's representatives bring back for discussion with the other representatives on the committee, the issue of control of zoning and development decisions within the urban reserve area

Request that the current language in Section 225.06 (2) (d) be retained

ide some standards for the term "likely to be urban" which is in the current BAA in on 225.06 1B, as codified in the Alachua County Code, so that the urban reserve are based on a reasonable expectation for population growth in a 10 year horizon, it's for the purposes of "green belt", that there be a conservation plan associated with that.
