*Re: Contract to return 100% of WCA's commercial waste to Alachua County*

Rick,

In consideration and approval of the proposed five year extension of the curbside collection contract with WCA, WCA would agree to a contract with Alachua County and return WCA's commercial collection disposal to Alachua County upon the extension being approved by the Alachua County BOCC. WCA would continue to operate said transfer station and only receive Class III and C&D material as defined by the State of Florida, for which it intends to recycle said material. WCA would continue to renew its current permit as issued by the State of Florida, as the WCA transfer station is a backup facility to Alachua County's transfer station in case of emergency or disaster. The contract would be an assignable document should WCA be acquired by another entity or WCA would sell its Gainesville operations. The contract may extend beyond the life of the current curbside collection contract or one or both extensions.
