## About the Orchestra

#### MISSION

The Gainesville Chamber Orchestra provides Alachua County and the surrounding areas quality programs through traditional and contemporary repertoire that entertain, enrich and educate a diverse and broad-based audience.

#### **HISTORY**

In 1983, a group of local musicians met to form the Gainesville Chamber Orchestra. Their first concert that fall presented a 34-member ensemble consisting of professionals, amateurs and gifted students. From this beginning, the GCO has been dedicated to performing live classical music in professionally produced, entertaining, and educational programs of great variety.

For over twenty years the Orchestra has been part of the cultural vitality of Alachua County.

Our commitment to education led to the creation of the Youth Concert Series. Since 1989, GCO has performed annual concerts for the schoolchildren of North Florida, who come from thirteen different counties. In 2002, GCO was honored with the New York Times Foundation Award for Excellence for our innovative educational programming.

During the 2001-2002 season, the Orchestra spearheaded the "T-Rex Named Sue" project, that brought the most complete *Tyrannosaurus rex* skeleton in the country to Gainesville, along with the *Cretaceous Concerto* by composer Bruce Adolphe, inspired by the fossil nicknamed "Sue." The "Sue" project had an estimated \$2.8 million dollar impact on Alachua County.

Today GCO has a committed core of 40 professional musicians whose services are in demand throughout the Southeast, and perform with orchestras in Atlanta, Savannah, Jacksonville, Tampa, Orlando, Naples and Miami. The Orchestra maintains a three-person part-time staff and operates with a budget of over \$145,000.

#### CONDUCTOR EVANS HAILE

Conductor Evans Haile joined the Orchestra as Music Director in 2001, continuing the GCO tradition of fine music in good company. Maestro Haile is a Gainesville native with an international reputation as a conductor, theater director, and radio personality. He has performed with major orchestras in Europe and the U.S., including appearances with the Boston Pops. He also acts as Artistic Director of America's oldest existing playhouse, the Cape Cod Playhouse.
