The FDOH solicited public comments on the draft Indoor Dust Study Report. Public comments were due to the FDOH on June 24, 2013. Based upon public comments, FDOH will make the necessary changes and ATSDOR will publish the report.

The Consent Decree was approved by the Federal Court on July 9, 2013, and off-site preparation work has begun. It is anticipated that off-site remediation work can begin by December, 2013 or January, 2014.

Rusty Kestle has been appointed the US EPA Acting Remedial Manager for the Cabot/Koppers Superfund Site beginning June 3, 2013, through December 1, 2013.

On September 5, 2013 Beazer East, Inc. made a presentation on the overview of clean-up plan for Cabot-Koppers Superfund site. The City Commission directed staff to increase the staff liaison commitment to the coordination effort by authorizing up to a full time position starting immediately until the off-site remediation is complete.

The LIT continues to hold monthly meeting and telephone conference calls with USEPA, Beazer East, Inc., FDEP and Cabot Corporation, Inc. on the status of the remediation plan for the superfund site.

January 2013 - The City continued to participate as a member of the LIT in providing technical assistance and comments on the progress of the remediation plan for the Cabot-Koppers Superfund Site. The Consent Decree has not been issued and the US EPA and Beazer East, Inc. are still negotiating the decree. The City of Gainesville developed a Cabot-Koppers webpage as part of the City Commission Initiative to provide more information to the public on the status of the Superfund Site. In May 2012. the US EPA conducted indoor dust sampling from 30 homes in selected areas of Gainesville. The intent of the indoor dust sampling was to investigate the issue of potential dust contamination in homes near Superfund site. Test results and the final report have not been released to the public or the LIT. Kestrel Ecological Services of Gainesville, a contractor for Beazer East, Inc., conducted a preliminary tree survey in part of the Stephen Foster Community as part of the offsite remediation

preparations. The City of Gainesville hired Temporary Project Manager, Amy Schafer to help develop a landscaping plan for the Stephen Foster Neighborhood and other off site areas. In addition, Ms. Schafer will be coordinating and communicating with the other community partners on additional services that the City can offer to the community as part of a general overall redevelopment approach near the Koppers Site. FDOH released the Final Cancer Review Study for the years 1981-2008 for Stephen Foster Neighborhood near the Superfund Site. Cabot Corporation conducted a soil gas investigation at the Northside Shopping Center located at the corner of NW 23rd Avenue and Main Street. The Soil Gas investigation was done at the request of US EPA as part of its on-going monitoring of the site. Cabot is processing the data and preparing a report. Additional soil sampling is being requested by the City of Gainesville for its Material Storage Yard after three previous soil samples were above the commercial level for the site. The soil sampling was conducted in October, 2012. A plan was developed for a demonstration study using a chemical injection technology known as ISGS to immobilize creosote in the Former Process Area (one of four contaminant source areas at the Koppers Site). The City and its consultant team and the LIT participated in development of the plan and in developing metrics for assessing the success of the treatment. As part of the plan, detailed testing was performed to develop a 3dimensional map of the creosote deposits in the process area. GRU and ACEPD continue working with Beazer and EPA to finalize the work plan. The chemical treatment and performance assessment are expected to begin in early 2013.

June 2012 - The Consent Decree is still being negotiated between the USEPA and Beazer East, Inc.

The LIT is working with the PGC Technical Advisor, Dr. Pat Cline, and the EPA to implement an Indoor Dust Study for homes impacted by the source area. In addition, the Indoor Dust Study area will include homes not directly impacted by the source area for background information and comparable data for the study. The LIT is still looking for at least fifteen (15) property owners not in the source area to participate in the study. Twenty four (24) property owners directly impacted by the source area have agreed to participate in the Indoor Dust Study.

The Gainesville City Commission authorized staff to coordinate and develop landscaping guidelines and a redevelopment plan for the Stephen Foster Neighborhood. City staff will work with community and neighborhood representatives including local landscaping experts to develop and provide recommended guidelines

for the neighborhood. Staff will be responsible for scheduling a meeting with Beazer East, Inc representatives to discuss the landscaping plan for the neighborhood impacted by the source area.

The City of Gainesville and Alachua County Environmental Protection Agency submitted comments to USEPA and Cabot Corporation, Inc on the Vapor Plan for the Northwest Shopping Center. City and County Staff expressed their concerns about the Community Outreach Plan. The Vapor Assessment Plan is still under review by all parties.

Beazer East, Inc. published a revised ISGS demonstration study work plan, in response to comments to the previously proposed work plan. It is anticipated that in summer 2012, additional testing will be performed in the former process area of the Koppers site to further define the location and extent of contamination in that area. Discussions on how the ISGS test will be evaluated are on-going.

The City and County staff continue to provide feedback and monitor the Cabot/Koppers site.

June 2011 - On February 2, 2011 the EPA released the Final Cleanup Plan Approved for Cabot Carbon/Koppers Superfund Site. On February 17, 2011, the City Commission received a presentation from the LIT on the Plan.

On March 7, 2011 the Mayor sent a letter to the EPA expressing the City's concerns with the plan and requesting that the EPA move forward with the clean-up as expeditiously as possible to assist the citizens of Gainesville.

The LIT continues to meet on a monthly basis and provide updates to the City Commission as they become available. A formal update to the City Commission is expected within the next few months.

On July 15, 2010, the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) released the Proposed Plan for the Cabot-Koppers Superfund Site. The public comment period is July 15, 2010 to August 15, 2010. EPA has scheduled a Public Meeting for August 5, 2010 at Stephen Foster Elementary School from 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm.

On July 22, 2010, the City Commission authorized staff to submit a letter to the EPA requesting a 60-day extension to the public comment period in order to allow sufficient time to engage the public, City and County Commission comments on the Proposed Plan.

A letter was sent to EPA on Tuesday, July 27, 2010, and a response was received on Thursday, July 28, 2010 that only a 30-day extension was being granted by EPA. The Local Technical Advisory Group (TAG) selected Dr. Pat Cline as the Technical Assistance Advisor. The Local Intergovernmental Team (LIT) will be inviting Dr. Cline to participate in the on-going Team meetings.
