

Greetings,
This letter is to confirm your offer to give the invocation at the City Commission meeting on Beginning with a moment of reflection and reverence is a tradition of this City as well as many other legislative bodies. Recent court decisions on legislative prayer provide guidelines that the City of Gainesville must follow. Therefore, we respectfully request your adherence to the following criteria.
Invocations should:
<ol> <li>Be void of reference to a specific deity, prophet, or religious figure identified with a specific religion (for example, Allah, Brahman, Christ Jesus, Ishtar, Krishna, Lord, Yahweh; or Buddha, Moses, Muhammad, etc.) and void of reference to a specific religion (for example, Buddhism, Christianity, Hinduism, Islam, Judaism, Wicca, etc.). General references to a supreme being (e.g., God, Source and Sustainer, etc.) are appropriate, as long as this does not serve to promote one faith or doctrine over others;</li> <li>Use language that respects the diversity of faiths in our community (e.g., by addressing the invocation with sensitivity regarding our differing perspectives on a supreme being);</li> <li>Not proselytize or promote any particular denomination or doctrine (e.g., inviting others to services, referencing the advantages of certain beliefs, or inviting others to join a particular religion);</li> <li>Refrain from criticizing or condemning any other faith or belief;</li> <li>Be offered for the sake of the Commission or the City in general, and not focused on particular individuals or agenda items (e.g., by praying for a specific outcome).</li> </ol>
Any questions regarding the application of these guidelines should be directed to the City Clerk's Office at (352) 334-5015. A substantive departure from these guidelines may preclude future invitations to offer the invocation.
We greatly appreciate your willingness to serve our community through this service. Thank you for your cooperation. At your earliest convenience, please provide confirmation of your intention to attend the designated City Commission meeting.
