NORTHEAST PARK OFF-LEASH DOG AREA SURVEY RESULTS

The Parks Division of the Recreation & Parks Department conducted a survey regarding the Off-Leash Dog Area installed at Northeast Park in February 2001. The survey was distributed by mail out to the property owners that lived within 400 feet of the park, posted on the City's Web Page and an intern with the Department conducted individual surveys on-site. In addition, surveys were placed at the Off-Leash Dog Area Information Kiosk along with information on how to receive a survey. The Parks Division received 85 surveys from both users and non-users of the Off-Leash Dog Area. Some of the returned surveys had multiple responses while others only answered a few questions or made brief statements. Below is a collated summary of the responses.

NOTE: Not every survey returned had every question answered.

1) How often do you bring a dog(s) to the Northeast Park Off-Leash Dog Area?

7) Do you feel that the Off-Leash Dog Area accomplishes its goal of increasing the comfort of visitors to the park who don't like to be around dogs?

- Gate is hard to open.
- Off-leash area needs to be bigger.
- Prohibit dogs from being in any other place in the park but the Off-Leash Area.

CONCLUSIONS:

It's apparent that the Off-Leash Dog Area at Northeast Park is acceptable and appreciated by the majority. However, there appears to be a feeling from some responses that it would be better located on the west side of the racquetball courts on the open area that is used for football practice, frisbee tossing and activities conducted by St. Patrick Physical Education classes.
