











The two locations identified with the highest number of incidents for both years, due to a number of retail thefts and other incidents are as follows:

1302 N Main Street – Publix Super Market 1028 N Main Street – Family Dollar Store


GPD Traffic Incident Analysis

There were a total of 105 reported traffic accidents in the Charrette area in 2009. There were 4,494 citywide.





There was a 29.52% decrease in reported accidents from year to year within the Charrette area.
