14 15	WHEREAS, at least 10 days notice has been given once by publication in a
16	newspaper of general circulation notifying the public of this proposed ordinance and of a
17	Public Hearing in the City Commission Auditorium in City Hall, City of Gainesville; and
18	WHEREAS, a Public Hearing was held pursuant to the published notice
19	described at which hearing the parties in interest and all others had an opportunity to be
20	and were, in fact, heard;
21	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE
22	CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA:
23	Section 1. Section 9-3 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Gainesville is
24	amended to read as follows:
25	Sec. 9-3. Designation, elections, runoff elections, pollworker training.
26	(a) Candidates for the commission shall, at the time of qualifying, designate the
27	district seat or at large seat for which they intend to run. The district candidate receiving
28	a majority of the votes cast in a particular district shall be elected. The at large or
29	mayoral candidate receiving a majority of the votes cast within the city at large shall be
30	elected. In the event no candidate receives a majority of the votes cast in a district or
31	the city at large, as applicable, a runoff election shall be held between the two

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candidates in such district(s) or at large, as applicable, receiving the highest number of
votes cast. The candidate receiving the highest number of votes cast in such runoff
election shall be elected. In the case of a tie the candidates shall be selected for the
runoff election in the same manner as provided by Florida Statutes.

5 (b) For purposes of poll worker training mandated by state law, the regular 6 and runoff elections shall be considered as one election. Therefore, in a city election 7 where there is a runoff election, one training is required.

Section 2. Subsections (a)(1), (2), (3), (4), (5), and (6) of Section 9-14 of the
Code of Ordinances of the City of Gainesville is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 9-14. Board of canvassers; composition; powers and duties.

11 (a) Composition.

- 12 (1) The board of canvassers for all elections held for election of city 13 commissioners or mayor and for questions submitted to a vote of the 14 people, except when state law requires the county canvassing board to be 15 used, is as follows: the mayor, the mayor pro tempore, of <u>or a member of</u> 16 <u>the commission, a citizen appointed by</u> the city commission, and the clerk 17 of the commission or designee.
- 18 (2) If <u>either</u> the mayor, or <u>the</u> mayor pro tempore, <u>or a member of the city</u> 19 <u>commission is: a)</u> unable to $serve_{\overline{r}}$; <u>b</u>) is a candidate who has opposition 20 in the election to be canvassed, or <u>c</u>) is an active participant in the 21 campaign or candidacy of any candidate who has opposition in the 22 election being canvassed, <u>then</u> the mayor shall appoint another member 23 of the city commission who is qualified and able to <u>city auditor or designee</u> 24 shall replace that member of the board of canvassers.

1 (3) The mayor, the mayor pro tempore, or a member of the city commission or 2 the appointed their replacement of the mayor shall serve as the chair of 3 the board of canvassers.

(4) In the event that only one member of the city commission is qualified or
able to serve on the board of canvassers, the substitute member of the board of
canvassers shall be a county court judge appointed by the chief judge of the
circuit. The member of the city commission shall serve as the chair of the board
of canvassers.

9 (5) In the event that no member of the city commission is qualified or able to 10 serve on the board of canvassers, the first substitute member of the board of 11 canvassers shall be a county court judge appointed by the chief judge of the 12 circuit. The second substitute member of the board of canvassers shall be the 13 supervisor of elections or designee. The county court judge shall serve as the 14 chair of the board of canvassers.

(6) In the event that a substitute member cannot be appointed as provided elsewhere in this section, the chief judge of the circuit shall appoint as a substitute member a qualified elector of the city who is not a candidate with opposition in the election being canvassed and who is not an active participant in the campaign or candidacy of any candidate with opposition in the election being canvassed.

Section 3. It is the intention of the City Commission that the provisions of Sections 1 and 2 of the Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Gainesville, Florida, and that the Sections and Paragraphs of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered in order to accomplish such intentions.

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1	Section 4. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is held to
2	be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, the said holding
3	shall in no way affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.
4	Section 5. All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, in conflict herewith are to the
5	extent of such conflict hereby repealed.
6	Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
