Third Model Block Home Available for Homeownership

Gainesville, Florida – The Gainesville Community Redevelopment Agency is pleased to announce that the third Model Block historic home is now available for homeownership. The Model Block Program is a joint housing initiative of the Gainesville Community Redevelopment Agency and the National Trust for Historic Preservation dedicated to the restoration of historic properties, compatible new home construction and home ownership.

The historic home is located at 418 Northwest 4th Avenue in the Pleasant Street National Register Historic District. This house is the third of five historic rehabs and five new construction projects that will be available in the Fifth Avenue Pleasant Street Redevelopment Area for purchase. The second home was sold in December 2007.

The Cook House is a 1, 287 square foot property, three bedroom, one and a half bathroom house that has been completely restored. Bid packets are available for those interested by contacting the CRA office at 334-2205. The home will be available for viewing at an Open House on Sunday, March 15, and Sunday, April 13, between 1 p.m. and 4 p.m. Appointments can be made to view the home. The Model Block houses are only available for homeownership and cannot be bought for rental properties. Anyone desiring to bid on the house can attend a pre-bid meeting on Wednesday, March 19 at 3 p.m. and April 16 at 3 p.m. at the Gainesville Community Redevelopment Agency, located at 300 East University Avenue. The Gainesville Community Redevelopment Agency office is located in Suite 240, on the second floor of the Commerce Center building. All offers must be submitted by April 30, 2008 at 3:00 p.m. to Gainesville Community Redevelopment Agency Suite 240 at 300 E. University Avenue.

The City of Gainesville established the Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) in 1981 to create a redevelopment framework in which the Central City District will evolve into a more dynamic office ,service, financial, entertainment, residential and governmental area. The authority to establish the CRA is enabled by Sections 163.330-163.45 Florida Statutes. Redevelopment is undertaken in four distinct redevelopment districts: Downtown, Fifth Avenue Pleasant Street, College Park University Heights, and the Eastside District, which was created last year. Redevelopment projects are coordinated in these districts by the CRA and implemented by a team of partners that includes other City departments and private citizens.

ainesville's drinking water supply is safe. Please be assured that recent articles appearing in the national media about pharmaceuticals found in other water supplies are not a cause for concern, because those articles refer to problems that are primarily associated with surface water sources such as lakes, rivers and reservoirs. Gainesville's drinking water supply comes from the Floridan Aquifer, which is a pristine underground source naturally protected from the type of contaminants that are of concern for surface water bodies and unprotected aquifers. We test for certain chemicals that are considered "indicators" if chemical contamination is present. None of these have ever been found in our water.
