SUBJECT:

<u>Petition 30ZON-08 PB.</u> City of Gainesville. Rezone the annexed area from Alachua County Conservation (C-1) to City of Gainesville Public services

and operations district (PS). Located at 7100 SW 41<sup>st</sup> Place (Kanapaha

Water Reclamation Facility). Related to 26LUC-08PB.

#### Note

This petition was presented to the Plan Board on March 20, 2008, where it was approved by a 5-0 vote. It was later found that the parcels included in the petition did not represent all lands to be included in the land use change. Therefore, the maps and legal description have been corrected. No changes have been made to the petition or staff report since it was originally heard by the Plan Board; it is being presented to correct the error.

## Recommendation

Planning Division staff recommends approval of Petition 30ZON-08PB.

#### **Explanation**

The Kanapaha Reclamation Facility is a City-owned and -operated wastewater management facility that has been in operation since 1977. The 136-acre subject property is located west of Lake Kanapaha, and includes the facility, constructed infiltration wetlands, and undeveloped land. See Map 1, attached.

This area was annexed by the City on May 14, 2007, and must be brought into conformance with the City's Generalized Future Land Use Map and Generalized Zoning Map. This petition requests a rezoning from Alachua County Conservation (C-1) to City of Gainesville Public services and operations district (PS). The related petition 26LUC-08PB amends the Future Land Use Element Map series to include the annexed areas.

### Character of the District and Suitability

The Public services and operations district (PS) zoning designation is suitable for the existing facility and its associated lands.

# Conservation of the Value of Buildings and Encouraging Appropriate Land Use

The proposed zoning is appropriate for the surrounding area and the underlying land use.

### Applicable Portions of Current City Plans

There are no current City plans for the area.

The subject property is outside of the TCEA (Transportation Concurrency Exception Area). Future development or redevelopment of the subject property will be required to meet all applicable concurrency requirements (i.e., transportation, potable water, wastewater, stormwater management, solid waste, and recreation and open space), or sign a Proportionate Fair Share agreement for transportation concurrency.

# Needs of the City for Land Areas for Specific Purposes to Serve Populations or Economic Activities

The proposed zoning is consistent with the underlying Public Facilities land use and will not have an effect on these considerations.

# Whether there have been Substantial Changes in the Character or Development of Areas In or Near Area Under Consideration

There have been no recent developments, or changes to land use or zoning in the vicinity.

#### Applicable Goals, Objectives and Policies of the Comprehensive Plan

#### **Future Land Use Element**

#### **Policy 4.1.1**

Land Use Categories on the Future Land Use Map shall be defined as follows:

**Public Facilities.** This category identifies administrative and operational governmental functions such as government offices, utility facilities and storage facilities. Maximum lot coverage in this district shall not exceed 80 percent.

#### Objective 4.4

Newly annexed lands shall retain land uses as designated by Alachua County until the Future Land Use Element of this Plan is amended.

- Policy 4.4.1 Land use amendments shall be prepared for all annexed properties within one year of annexation.
- Policy 4.4.2 Alachua County LOS standards shall apply until newly annexed lands are given land use designations in this Plan.

# **Summary**

This petition requests a land use change from County to City designations for several recently annexed parcels. The land is owned by the City and is occupied by an existing water reclamation facility, constructed wetlands, and undeveloped areas. Surrounding land uses include conservation land, a County-owned passive park, and undeveloped low-density residential.

The proposed land use change is consistent with the 2000-2010 Gainesville Comprehensive Plan, and is recommended for approval.
