Allows preference to any *local vendor* providing certain goods/services to City based on geographical factors

Resolution 970214

Relates to the *Local Minority* Business and *Local Small* Business Procurement Program

CURRENT POLICIES

Purchasing Policy- Small Business Program Component

- Allows waiver of competitive bids for first-time orders with a SBE
- \$10,000 maximum purchase

Local Preference Ordinance No. 001261

Effective: October 1, 2004

Intent: Funds generated in the community should, to the extent possible, be placed back into the local economy

Applies to most purchases over \$50,000

Exceptions

- cooperative purchasing agreement
- professional services subject to the Consultant's Competitive Negotiation Act
- purchases funded by a governmental entity
- emergency or non-competitive situations
- purchases of \$50,000 or less.

Local Preference Ordinance No. 001261

Vendor Eligibility:

- Hold valid City occupational license at least 6 months prior to bid/proposal opening date; and
- Operate their business within City limits

Preference Amounts:

- 5% of local business' total bid price (\$25,000 limit), or
- 5% of the total evaluation points, if factors other than price are taken into account

Effective: July 27, 1997

Primary Objective:

• To encourage development of local minority and local small businesses, and the diversification of goods and services provided by such businesses

Resolution 970214 - Local Minority Business & Local Small Business Procurement Program

Policies Established

- Ensure non-discrimination in all aspects of City's contracting and procurement programs
- Develop programs to create significant opportunities for eligible local minority and local small businesses to participate, on a nondiscriminatory basis, in business transactions of the City
- Assist the development of firms that can successfully compete in the marketplace outside this program

Resolution 970214 - Local Minority Business & Local Small Business Procurement Program

2005 Program Revisions

- Emphasizes maximizing opportunities for local small businesses to compete for City purchases
- Requires bidders/proposers to make Good Faith Efforts to maximize utilization of local small business subcontractors
- Requires Equal Opportunity Assurance
