WHEREAS, July 26, 2011, marks the 21^{st} anniversary of the passage of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA); and

WHEREAS, the ADA states as its purpose to provide "a clear and comprehensive national mandate for the elimination of discrimination against individuals with disabilities;" and

WHEREAS, city policy prohibits discrimination in employment, housing, public accommodation and credit against persons because of a disability; and

WHEREAS, we encourage all citizens of Gainesville to become more familiar with this important piece of civil rights legislation and challenge perceptions and beliefs about disabilities; and

WHEREAS, we encourage both private and public sector organizations conducting business within the city limits of Gainesville to become aware of and make a commitment to carrying out the mandates of the ADA; and


WHEREAS, on this day the city affirms its commitment to ensuring that all of its services, programs and activities are accessible to all qualified persons.
