## **Letter of Interest**

Fragmentation of landscape to serve the needs of man is no new story. When Europeans first found their way to North America they met a large population of organic permaculturists that could have taught seminars at Humbolt. Conservationists are confronting the issue of "man as a part of nature" continually in an attempt to create a best- case scenario for all living things. Urban Planners must attempt to save a little in the name of parks, ponds and passages for those less resource ravenous than us. Parks are saviors to fragmented urban areas: too much is never enough when it comes to wild spaces, but management does what it can with what it is given and lobbies for more.

The Morningside Nature Center is a substantial chunk of park-managed landscape inside the boundaries of the Gainesville Florida municipality. If avian voices were intelligible to humans we would hear songs of thanks all around. My first experience at the center was with UF's Avian Biology course in graduate school. I wrote a paper on avian informed sculpture for the class. Doug Levy and his graduate students may be able to confirm the throated messages for they are so in tune with birds I expected them to fly. I was always several birds behind and squinting with a panic when we were in the field. Birders are intense folks! I intend to involve as many of the passionate bird lovers interested to select the species for the weather vane final and have a call for found object contributions.

North Central Florida and the Morningside Center are premier habitats for birds and the sculpture I propose will celebrate the management and educational work of the center, and the beauty of the area. Echoing the living history, all materials will be post -consumer recyclia and low - impact processes will be used whenever possible. I have an extensive background in building structures from salvaged and natural materials that do not leak and will not fail. My work on Andros Island stands up to the harshest storms and rains. I have just completed a work at the Gainesville Regional Airport and continue to seek creative challenges in the area.

Look up and see the birds they are the best of us!

# **Design Theme**

The work will have the look of an old farm weather vane of odd materials (stainless steel and copper alloys). Recyclia itself tends toward its own patination and weathered look. As the drawing shows the mechanism for rotation will be a shaft of stainless rotating on wheel bearings after the last globe of the rod and at the beam mount. The compass directions will be fixed in an exterior tube so that they can be set at the roof. The only rule to a weather vane telling the direction that the wind is coming from is that the "tail" must be offset on the shaft to catch more wind than the head. Use your binoculars for an up close look.
