AN ORDINANCE AMENDING APPENDIX A, SECTION UTILITIES (7) IN GENERAL OF THE GAINESVILLE CODE OF ORDINANCES BY AMENDING SERVICE CHARGES; PROVIDING A REPEALING CLAUSE; PROVIDING DIRECTIONS TO THE CODIFIER; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND, PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, at least ten (10) days notice has been given of the public hearings once by publication in a newspaper of general circulation notifying the public of this proposed ordinance and of the public hearings in the City Commission meeting room, first floor, City Hall, City of Gainesville; and

WHEREAS, the public hearings were held pursuant to the published notices described above at which hearings in the parties in interest and all others had an opportunity to be and were, in fact, heard.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA:

Section 1. Appendix A, Section Utilities (7) of the Gainesville Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

UTILITIES:

(7) In general:

a. Residential deposits (§ 27-7):

- 1. Electric service \$100.00
- 2. Water service \$ 20.00
- 3. Wastewater service \$ 40.00
- 4. Gas service \$ 50.00

b. Service charges:

- 1. Specially arranged visit for meter reader to read meter (§ 27-8c) \$ 20.00
- 2. Installation or turn-on of service (§ 27-15a):
 - (i) Electric service:
 - (A) Non-demand meter \$ 30.00
 - (B) Demand meter \$ 60.00
 - (ii) Water service \$ 30.00
 - (iii) Gas service:
 - (A) Residential, with electric or water turn-on \$ 40.00
 - (B) Residential, gas turn-on only \$ 50.00
 - (C) All other retail classifications \$100.00
 - (iv) In addition to all other applicable charges, the following rates may also apply:
 - (A) If guaranteed is requested for the same or any fully-scheduled workday*..... \$ 40.00
 - (B) If service is provided anytime on holidays or weekends..... \$ 50.00

* Workdays shall be weekdays, except for city holidays.

- 17 (D) Turn on gas where the customer failed to appear as scheduled \$ 20.00
- 18 (E) Light pilot light for natural gas appliance..... \$ 50.00
- 19 (iii) Meter testing charges:
- 20 (A) Electric, if meter not more than two percent fast (§ 27-26.1)..... \$ 20.00
- 21 (B) Gas, deposit (§ 27-280.2) \$ 10.00
- 22 (C) Water, testing by meter size:


3 **Section 2.** All ordinances in conflict herewith are to the extent of such conflict hereby repealed.

4 **Section 3.** It is the intention of the City Commission that the provisions of Section 1 of this Ordinance shall
5 become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Gainesville, Florida, and that the Sections and
6 Paragraphs of this Ordinance may be renumbered or re-lettered in order to accomplish such intentions.


7 **Section 4.** If any word, phrase, clause, paragraph, section or provision of this ordinance or the application
8 hereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid or unconstitutional, such finding shall not affect the other
9 provisions or applications of the ordinance which can be given effect without the invalid or unconstitutional
10 provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are declared severable.

11 **Section 5.** This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its adoption; provided however, the rates
12 and charges as provided for herein shall be applicable to all monthly bills which are for the first time rendered and
13 postmarked after 12:01 A.M., October 1, 2009.


