WHEREAS, the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children® (NCMEC) exists as a resource to help prevent child abduction and sexual exploitation, to help find missing children and to assist victims of child abduction and sexual exploitation, their families and the professionals who serve them; and

WHEREAS, more than 2.2 million reports of suspected child exploitation have been made to NCMEC's CyberJipline® between 1998 and December 2013; and

WHEREAS, National Missing Children's Day is a special time to remember those children who are missing and give hope to their families; and

WHEREAS, the Take 25 Campaign through NCMEC encourages families, teachers and trusted adults of the nation to take 25 minutes to teach their children about safety, both online and in everyday life, on May  $25^{th}$  of every year.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Edward B. Braddy, by the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Gainesville, do hereby proclaim May 25, 2014 as
