The City adopted Ordinance No. 0-08-70 at its regular Commission meeting on April 2, 2009, adding social services (MG-83), residences for destitute people, food distribution centers for the needy, dormitories, rooming houses and boarding houses (GN-702), rehabilitation centers, and social service homes or halfway houses to the list of prohibited uses in the Five Points Special Area. - 4. City Ordinance No. 0-08-70 prohibits CPM's proposed use of its above-described property.
