On January 14, 1999, the City of Gainesville applied for funding for the construction of a boardwalk at the Mason Manor trail through the Florida Greenways and Trails Seed Grants Program. The \$10,000 proposal included the construction of a footbridge, information kiosks and educational interpretation, re-vegetation and restoration of the Mason Manor trail.
