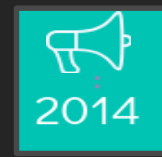

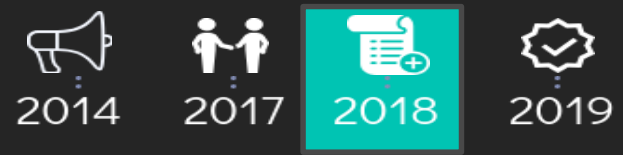

Assistant City Manager Hoffman presented the draft of Open Data Resolution.

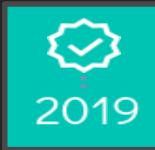

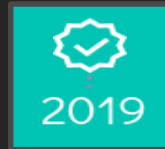

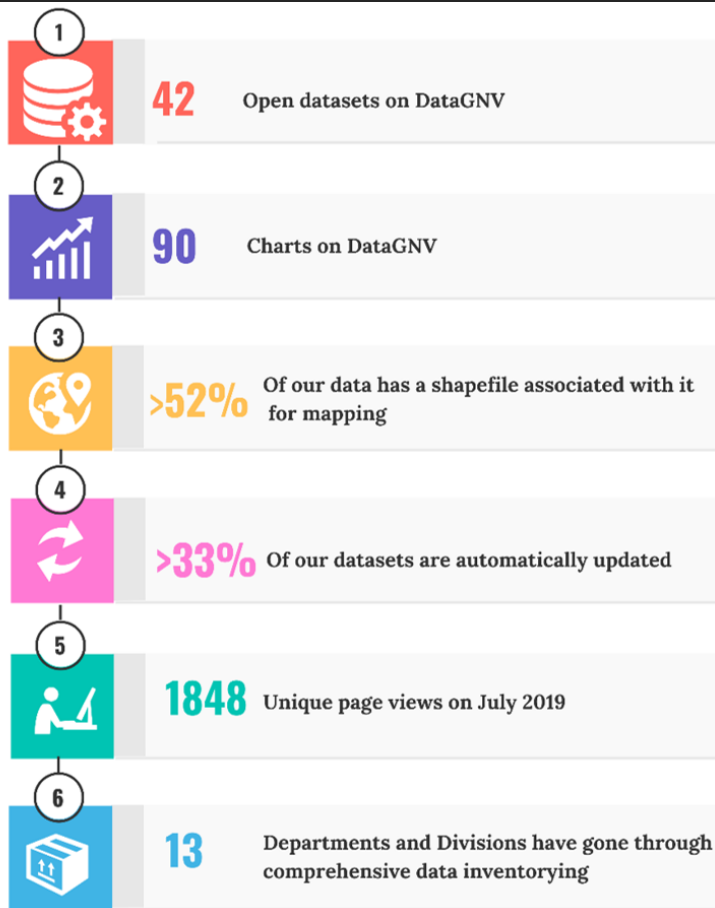

- Provides a lasting support for the Open Data initiatives to foster an open, transparent, and accessible government
- Encourages academic access and research, and establishes partnerships to collaboratively solve community challenges
- Promotes opportunity for economic development and entrepreneurship
