Girls Place Referral to Parks, Recreation and Cultural Affairs (B)

This item involves a request for referral from the Gainesville City Commission to the Recreation, Cultural Affairs and Public Works Committee (RCAPW) regarding a proposal from Girls Place, Inc. for consideration of a partnership with the City of Gainesville to transform the infield of the existing track in Greentree Park into a multi-purpose recreational field in an effort to promote youth development and community health.

Explanation: Girls Place, Inc. has been a part of the youth development community since 1985 and currently serves over 600 girls ages 5-18 each year through after school, summer camp, and athletics. In 2014, there were over 180 girls who participated in their volleyball leagues. Participation was limited due to available space. Girls Place, Inc. Board of Directors wrote a letter, dated February 26, 2015, to the Director of Parks, Recreation and Cultural Affairs requesting consideration of a partnership with the City of Gainesville to transform the infield of the existing track in Greentree Park into a multi-purpose recreational field in an effort to promote youth development and community health. If approved, Girls Place, Inc. plans to expand their gymnasium, move the multi-purpose field to the track area and share Greentree Park's softball facility for their programs. They are prepared to launch a capital campaign of approximately \$5 million, if approved. This partnership would benefit all parties involved; Girls Place, Inc., Parks, Recreation and Cultural Affairs, and the community at large by promoting youth development and community health.

> On Wednesday, April 15, 2015 representatives from The Girls Place presented their letter and the scope of their project to the Public Recreation and Parks Advisory Board. The Board unanimously supports their proposal. On July 2nd, the City Commission referred this matter to the Recreation. Cultural Affairs and Public Works Committee for further discussion.

Fiscal Note: There is no fiscal impact resulting from Committee discussion of the proposal from Girls Place, Inc.

RECOMMENDATION

The Recreation, Cultural Affairs and Public Works Committee: 1) hear a brief report from staff regarding a proposal from Girls Place, Inc. to transform the infield of the existing track in Greentree Park into a multi-purpose recreational field in an effort to promote youth development and community health, and 2) approve the concept of the proposal.
