Assistant City Manager Paul Folkers introduced Kim Tanzer, former Dean of Architecture at the University of Virginia and professor at the University of Florida, who has been working with City staff per the RCAPW Committee's recommendation

in August, and who has developed a proposal for her spring studio to collaborate with the City and the Golfview neighborhood to create a case study on aging infrastructure and new technology. The outcome will be a report of recommendations for modernizing the neighborhoods, a model that would be applicable city-wide. Commissioner Warren moved that the Committee "take this recommendation to the City Commission with an informational presentation from Public Works and GRU to show how staff is addressing infrastructure issues, using Golfview as a model for other City neighborhoods." The motion was approved by consensus.

RECOMMENDATION *The Committee hear a presentation and proposal from residents of the Golfview neighborhood on Integrated 21st Century Infrastructure.*

Girls Place Referral to Parks, Recreation and Cultural Affairs (B)

This item involves a request for referral from the Gainesville City Commission to the Recreation, Cultural Affairs and Public Works Committee (RCAPW) regarding a proposal from Girls Place, Inc. for consideration of a partnership with the City of Gainesville to transform the infield of the existing track in Greentree Park into a multi-purpose recreational field in an effort to promote youth development and community health.

Paul Folkers introduced the item and Michelle Park, Assistant Director for Parks, Recreation, and Cultural Affairs, and Janna Magrette, Executive Director of Girls Place, explained the proposal to allow Girls Place to make specific improvements to the field at Greentree Park to make it a multipurpose field, and how this partnership fits the PRCA's Master Plan and enhances the City's current facilities. Commissioner Warren moved to "move the topic to public meeting for the neighborhood and other interested parties, and then on to the City Commission for review and/or approval" and she encouraged staff to continue communicating and working with Girls Place. The motion was approved.

RECOMMENDATION *The Recreation, Cultural Affairs and Public Works Committee: 1) hear a brief report from staff regarding a proposal from Girls Place, Inc. to transform the infield of the existing track in Greentree Park into a multi-purpose recreational field in an effort to promote youth development and community health, and 2) approve the concept of the proposal.*
