Dear Mr. McLeod,

It has recently come to my attention that you did not receive a response to the letter you sent to me dated October 5th, 2007. I believe your October letter to me was sent in response to a letter I mailed to you a few weeks before, dated September 18th, 2007. In my September 18th letter I stated at the bottom, "As far as I am concerned the matter has been handled appropriately." Your response letter stated nothing that you had not already alleged and again brought up issues that are not remotely related to the reasons you were convicted of your crimes. For that reason I am again informing you that your claims have been investigated repeatedly by this agency and other agencies and will not be investigated further.

The one new request you made was for Det. P. Nixon's internal affairs history related to discipline stemming out of her mistakenly entering a piece of evidence on another case under the incorrect case number. This entire incident took place long before I was assigned to the Investigations Bureau but I was told Det. Nixon received verbal counseling which would be normal for this type of mistake. There is no written record of it. Even if there was a written record, neither you nor I would have access to it because Florida State Statute allows for the destruction of IA reports for minor infractions after one year.

Again, your allegations have been looked into multiple times. Det. P. Nixon is a trustworthy, thorough, and dedicated employee. She has an exemplary career at our Department. The claims that she disguised her voice to sound like a man, to sound like you specifically, are preposterous at best. NASA independently proved what we already knew to be true. Please know I am serious when I tell you that any further allegations made against Det. Nixon related to this case will not be investigated.
