Re: Public retail application of WCA's CNG project.

Steve,

In discussions with Teresa Scott, I learned of concern on the City of Gainesville's part, that WCA had possibly changed course on our commitment to the public retail component. I want to assure you and the City of Gainesville, that we have not changed course and are fully committed to providing the first retail CNG station in Alachua County with the approval of the extension of curbside collection contract. As was discussed with Teresa Scott; a misunderstanding occurred between WCA and GRU on who would pay for running the natural gas lines for our project. It was our understanding that GRU would pay for all the lines including the gas line from WCA on SW 41st Blvd to the retail station (Chevron) owned by Lewis Oil on Williston Road. GRU informed WCA that they would not incur those costs between the two private entities and would only incur the costs of the line to WCA. Due to those increased costs with the project and current year CAPEX commitments, we determined that we would need to finish this portion of the project in 2014. It is our intent to have the retail application operating by the second quarter of 2014. WCA is committed to the partnership with the City of Gainesville and Alachua County and I hope this letter gives you more clarity on the subject. I thank you and the City of Gainesville for support of this project and partnership.
