17	described at which hearing the parties in interest and all others had an opportunity to be
18	and were, in fact, heard;
9	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE
20	CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA:
21	Section 1. Subsection (a) of Section 9-2 of the Code of Ordinances of the City
22	of Gainesville is amended to read as follows:
23	Sec. 9-2. Date of regular elections for city commissioners and mayor.
24	(a) Regular elections shall be held in March or April of each year, on a date
25	set by the city commission by ordinance, for the election of city commissioners,
26	including the mayor, whose terms of office expire or to fill vacancies that may occur. In

the event no candidate receives a majority of the votes cast in an election to fill a

district, mayoral or at large vacancy, a runoff election shall be held on the third fourth

Tuesday following the first election between the two candidates for such district(s),

mayoral or at large seat receiving the highest number of votes cast.

(b) The clerk of the commission shall recommend a date for the next regular election to the commission at or before the first regular city commission meeting in May of each year. The city commission shall determine the date and direct an ordinance be drafted and advertised setting the election date of the next regular election. This ordinance shall be adopted no later than July 1 of each year.

- (c) If for any reason the city commission does not adopt an ordinance setting the date of the next regular election by July 1 of any year, the next regular election shall be held on the third Tuesday in March of the following year.
- (d) When considering the date of the next election, the city commission may consider factors including, but not limited to:
 - (1) The schedules for Spring Break of the Alachua County School Board, Santa Fe Community College and the University of Florida;
 - (2) The transition time between the election and the start of the terms of office of the new commissioners; and
 - (3) The dates of county-wide or state-wide elections occurring at about the same time.
- **Section 2.** It is the intention of the City Commission that the provisions of Section 1 of the Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Gainesville, Florida, and that the Sections and Paragraphs of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered in order to accomplish such intentions.
- **Section 3.** If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, the said holding shall in no way affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.
