4	An ordinance of the City of Gainesville, Florida, amending
5	Chapter 14 relating to the State Housing Initiatives
6	Partnership (SHIP) Program; by adding definitions in section
7	14-1; by deleting existing section 14-6 in its entirety and
8 9	replacing with new section 14-6 creating and establishing an Affordable Housing Advisory Committee; by deleting existing
10	section 14-7 and replacing with a new section 14-7 providing
11	for the adoption of local housing initiative strategies; providing
12	directions to the codifier; providing a severability clause;
13	providing a repealing clause; and providing an effective date.
14 15	
16	WHEREAS, at least 10 days notice has been given once by publication in a newspaper
17	of general circulation notifying the public of this proposed ordinance and of a public hearing to
18	be held in the City Commission Auditorium, City Hall, City of Gainesville; and
19	WHEREAS, the Public Hearings were held pursuant to the published notice described at
20	which hearings the parties in interest and all others had an opportunity to be and were, in fact,
21	heard.
22	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE
23	CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA:
24	Section 1. Section 14-1 of the Code of Ordinances is amended to add the following new
25	definitions and the remaining definitions within section 14-1 shall remain unchanged and in
26	effect:
27	Sec. 14-1. Definitions.
28	Affordable housing advisory committee means the committee appointed by resolution of the city
29	commission as required by state law for the purpose of recommending specific initiatives and
30	incentives to encourage or facilitate affordable housing within the city.
31 32	Local housing incentive strategies means local regulatory reform or incentive programs to
33	encourage or facilitate affordable housing production, which include at a minimum, assurance
34	that development orders and permits for affordable housing projects are expedited to a greater
35	degree than other projects: an ongoing process for review of local policies, ordinances,

1	regulations, and plan provisions that increase the cost of housing prior to their adoption; and a
2	schedule for implementing the incentive strategies. Local housing incentive strategies may also
3 4	include other regulatory reforms adopted by the city commission.
5	Section 2. Section 14-6 of the Code of Ordinances is amended in its entirety to read as follows:
6 7	Sec. 14-6. Affordable housing advisory committee.
8 9 10	(a) The affordable housing advisory committee is created and established to recommend monetary and nonmonetary local housing incentive strategies to be included in the local housing assistance plan as provided in Sec. 14-7. and such other duties as may be established by the city
11	commission. The city commission shall appoint the members to the committee by resolution.
12 13 14 15	(b) The affordable housing advisory committee shall consist of eleven members. The composition of the committee shall include the following individuals as required by state law:
16 17	(1) One citizen who is actively engaged in the residential home building industry in connection with affordable housing.
18 19	(2) One citizen who is actively engaged in the banking or mortgage banking industry in connection with affordable housing.
20 21	(3) One citizen who is a representative of those areas of labor actively engaged in home building in connection with affordable housing.
22 23	(4) One citizen who is actively engaged as an advocate for low-income persons in connection with affordable housing.
24	(5) One citizen who is actively engaged as a for-profit provider of affordable housing
25 26	(6) One citizen who is actively engaged as a not-for-profit provider of affordable housing.
27 28	(7) One citizen who is actively engaged as a real estate professional in connection with affordable housing.
29	(8) One citizen who actively serves on the city plan board
30	(9) One citizen who represents employers within the jurisdiction.
31 32	(10) One citizen who represents essential services personnel, as defined in the local housing assistance plan.
33	(11) One other citizen
34 35 36 37	(c) If the city commission, whether due to the presence of a conflict of interest by prospective appointees, or other reasonable factor(s), is unable to appoint a citizen actively engaged in the above activities "in connection with affordable housing", a citizen engaged in the activity without regard to affordable housing may be appointed.

1 (d) The members of the committee shall be and remain bona fide residents of the city. If at
2 any time any member of the committee fails to be and remain a resident of the city that member
3 shall be automatically disqualified and removed from the committee.
4 (e) Members shall be appointed for a term of two years. Members may be reappointed for
5 consecutive terms, but no member shall serve more than three successive terms. Reappointment
6 may then occur after at least one year of absence from the committee. If a vacancy occurs, a new

appointment shall be made by resolution of the city commission for the remainder of the

unexpired term.

- Six members of the committee shall constitute a quorum sufficient to permit the committee to take any formal action. Formal action of the committee must be approved by an affirmative vote of a majority of its entire membership (i.e., 6 members). The committee may meet to hear presentations with less than a quorum in attendance, provided the meeting is duly noticed and formal action is not taken at the meeting. The committee may elect a chairperson or presiding officer and may adopt rules of procedures to carry out its duties. All rules of procedure must conform to this article, the Code of Ordinances, Rules of the City Commission and state law.
 - (g) All meetings of the committee are public meetings and all committee records are public records. Staff, administrative and facility support for the affordable housing advisory committee shall be provided by the city housing division, and by the city planning and development services department to the extent necessary to ensure an integrated approach to the work of the committee.
 - (h) Except as otherwise provided herein, the general regulation of committees as set forth in Chapter 2, Article V, Division 1 shall apply to this committee.
 - (a) The affordable housing advisory committee is hereby created and established. The members of the advisory committee shall be appointed by resolution of the city commission.
 - (b) The resolution appointing the members of the affordable housing advisory committee shall define affordable housing as applicable to the city in a way that is consistent with the adopted local comprehensive plan.
 - (c) The affordable housing advisory committee shall be in effect for a period of two (2) years and then shall sunset. The committee shall consist of nine (9) members. Five (5) members shall constitute a quorum. The committee may not take formal actions unless a quorum is present, but may meet to hear presentations if duly noticed. The affordable housing advisory committee shall include the following:
 - (1) One city resident who is actively engaged in the residential building industry.
 - (2) One city resident who is actively engaged in the banking or mortgage industry.
 - (3) One city resident who is a representative of those areas of labor engaged in home building.

1 2	(4) One city resident who is designated as an advocate for low-income persons.
3	(5) One city resident who is a provider of affordable housing.
4 5	(6) One city resident who is a real estate professional.
6 7	(7) Three other city residents.
8 9	(d) Members shall serve for one term only.
10 11 12	(e) Frequency of meetings shall be established by the committee.
13 14 15 16	(f) The affordable housing advisory committee shall comply with the Government in the Sunshine Law, the public records law, and the special provisions regarding notice of affordable housing incentive plan considerations provided in F.S. § 420.9076.
17 18 19 20	(g) The affordable housing advisory committee shall annually elect a chairperson, vice-chairperson and such other officers as it deems necessary. The chairperson is charged with the duty of conducting meetings in a manner consistent with law.
21 22 23	(h) Staff, administrative and facility support for the affordable housing advisory committee shall be provided by the city manager.
24 25 26 27	(i) The affordable housing advisory committee shall review the established policies and procedures, ordinances, land development regulations, and adopted local comprehensive plan of the city and shall recommend specific initiatives and other incentives to encourage or facilitate affordable housing.
28 29 30 31 32 33 34 35 36 37 38	(j) Within nine (9) months from the appointment of the affordable housing advisory committee the committee shall make recommendations approved by a majority of its membership at a public hearing. Notice of the time, date and place of the public hearing of the affordable housing advisory committee to adopt final affordable housing incentive recommendations shall be published in a newspaper of general paid circulation in the city. Such notice shall contain a short and concise summary of the affordable housing incentive recommendations to be considered by the affordable housing advisory committee. The notice shall also state the public place where a copy of the tentative affordable housing advisory committee recommendation can be obtained by interested persons.
39 40 41 42	(k) To the maximum extent feasible, the approved affordable housing incentive recommendations submitted must quantify the affordable housing cost reduction anticipated from implementing the specific recommendation.
43	Section 3. Section 14-7 of the Code of Ordinances is amended in its entirety to read as follows:

1	(b) To the maximum extent feasible, the report of recommendations for local housing				
2	incentive strategies submitted to the mayor and city commission shall quantify the affordable				
3	housing cost reduction anticipated from implementing the specific recommendations.

5	(c) The report shall be approved by formal action of the committee at a public hearing.				
6	Public notice of the hearing shall include the time, date and place and shall be published in a				
7 8	newspaper of general paid circulation. The notice shall provide a short and concise summary of				
9	the local housing incentive strategy recommendations to be considered by the committee. The notice shall state the public place where a copy of the committee recommendations can be				
10	obtained by interested persons.

12	(d) Within 90 days after receipt of the report from the committee, the city commission shall				
13	adopt an amendment to the local housing assistance plan to incorporate the local housing				
14	incentive strategies it will implement within the city. The city commission must consider the				
15 16	strategies specified in Sec. 14-7.(a) as recommended by the committee. The city commission				
17	may also consider other regulatory reforms and incentives that encourage or facilitate affordable housing. The amendment shall include specific initiatives to encourage or facilitate affordable				
18	housing and a schedule for implementation. At a minimum, the amendment shall include the				
19	following:				
20	(1) A schedule for implementation of expedited permit processing for affordable				
21 22	housing projects; and				
23	(2) A process for review of local policies, ordinances, regulations, and incentive plan				
24	provisions that significantly impact the cost of housing prior to their adoption.				
25	provisions that significantly impact the cost of nousing prior to their adoption.				
26	(a) Within ninety (90) days after the date of the receipt of the affordable housing incentive				
27	recommendations from the affordable housing advisory committee, the city commission shall				
28	adopt the affordable housing incentive plan as submitted or as amended. The affordable housing				
29	incentive plan shall consist of the adoption of specific initiatives to encourage or facilitate				
30	affordable housing and a schedule for implementation and must include, at a minimum:				
31					
32	(1) A schedule for implementation of expedited permit processing for affordable				
33	housing projects; and				
34					
35	(2) An ongoing process for review of local policies, ordinances, regulations and				
36	comprehensive plan provisions that significantly impact the cost of housing.				
37					
38	(b) Upon adoption of the affordable housing incentive plan the city manager shall notify the				
39	state housing finance agency by certified mail. The notice shall include a copy of the				
40	approved affordable housing incentive plan.				
41 42	Section 4. It is the intention of the City Commission that the provisions of Sections 1, 2 and 3				
43	shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Gainesville, Florida,				

1	and that the sections and paragraphs of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered in order	
2	to accomplish such intentions.	
3	Section 5. If any word, phrase, clause, paragraph, section or provision of this ordinance or the	
4	application hereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid or unconstitutional, such finding	
5	shall not affect the other provisions or applications of the ordinance which can be given effect	
6	without the invalid or unconstitutional provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of	
7	this ordinance are declared severable.	
8	Section 6. All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, in conflict herewith are to the extent of such	
9	conflict hereby repealed.	
10	Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect on May 15, 2008 at 11:59 p.m.
