17	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE

9	Section 1. Subsection (6) of Section 27-240 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of				
20	Gainesville is amended to read as follows:				
21	Sec. 27-240. Same – Duties and powers.				
22	The stormwater management utility shall have all powers necessary for the exercise of its				
23	responsibility for the drainage from all properties within the city, including, but not limited to,				
24	the following:				
25	(1) Preparation of plans for improvements and betterments to the stormwater				
26	management system.

1 (2) Construction of improvements and betterments to the stormwater management system. 2 (3) Promulgation of regulations for the use of the stormwater management system, 3 including provisions for enforcement of such regulations. 4 (4) Review and approval of all new development permits within the city for compliance 5 with stormwater management regulations included in present city ordinances or 6 7 ordinances later adopted. (5) Performance of routine maintenance and minor improvement to the stormwater 8 9 management system. 10 (6) Establishment of charges for the city's stormwater management system. (7) Evaluation of water quality concerns for discharges to the stormwater management 11 system. 12 (8) Performance of all normal utility functions to include construction, operation, and 13 maintenance of the city's stormwater management system, including, but not limited 14 to, the hiring of staff, the selection of special consultants, the entering into contracts 15 for services and construction of facilities, and the handling of purchase, lease, sale or 16 other rights to property for the stormwater management system. 17 (9) Issuance of revenue bonds for the purpose of performing those duties as described 18 herein. 19 Section 2. Subsection (b) of Section 27-241 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of 20 Gainesville is amended to read as follows: 21

- (b) Rates for stormwater management service. There is charged to all owners or occupants of real property in the city, with improvements or uses thereon which contribute stormwater runoff to the city's stormwater management system, a monthly fee as established by separate ordinance in accordance with the following definitions:
- Single-family property service charges. Each single-family property shall be (1)considered one ERU for billing purposes. Monthly service charges for each singlefamily dwelling unit shall be identical, provided that the ratio of impervious area to total area of the lot does not exceed 50 percent and the total area of the lot exceeds 10,000 square feet. If the ratio of impervious to total area exceeds 50 percent and the total area of the lot exceeds 10,000 square feet, the rates established in subsection (b)(3) shall apply.
- (2) Multifamily property service charges. The monthly service charge for all multifamily properties shall be:
 - Duplex units = One ERU/dwelling unit
 - Condominium units = One ERU/dwelling unit
- 19 Apartment units = 0.6 ERU/dwelling unit
- Mobile homes = 0.6 ERU/dwelling unit 20
- Definition of dwelling unit shall be those living areas served by individual electric 21
- and/or water meters. 22

2	(3)	Nonnresidential/commercial property service charge. Nonresidential/commercial
3		property service charge shall be:
4 5 6 7		No. Base ERU's = <u>Impervious Area (sq. ft.) + 0.5 (Partial Impervious Area (sq. ft.)</u> 2,300 sq. ft.
8		No. Billable ERU's = No. Base ERU's x $(1 - Retention Credit Factor)$
9		Monthly Service Charge = (No. Billable ERU's) x (Rate/ERU)
10		A minimum value of 1.0 ERU shall be assigned to each
11		nonresidential/commercial property unless such property has earned a 100-percent
12		retention credit, in which case, the property will be assigned a value of 0.0 ERU.
13		The impervious area of each nonresidential/commercial property shall be
14		determined by the city manager or designee.
15	(4)	Application to all developed properties. Service charges shall apply to all
16		developed properties within the city using the city's stormwater management
17		system, including those properties classified as nonprofit or tax-exempt for ad
18		valorem tax purposes. Service charges shall apply to all government properties,
19		including properties of the city, including the city-owned buildings, parks, and
20		other properties.
21	(5)	Undeveloped property. Stormwater management service charges shall not be
22		charged to undeveloped property that has not been altered from the natural state as
23		defined under section 27-237, "impervious area" and "partial impervious area."

1	Farmland, gardens, and landscaped areas shall also be exempt except for any roads,				
2	parking, or structures associated therewith.				
3	Section 3. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is held to be invalid				
4	or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, then said holding shall in no way				
5	affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.				
6	Section 4. All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, in conflict herewith are to the extent of				
7	such conflict hereby repealed.				
8	Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
