City of Gainesville Goals Workshop January 22, 1999 Poe Springs, Florida

I. COMMISSIONERS' GOALS

A. City-County Coordination

- 1. Emergency communications
 - a. Seek County participation
 - b. Move toward joint dispatching
- 2. Annexation
 - a. Build on success
 - b. Prepare for April vote
- 3. Transportation concurrency issues
 - a. Discuss impact fees to recoup some of the costs of new development (County repealed its impact fee program because it hindered development in marginal areas.)
 - b. Consider impact fee on sliding scale (Consider special fund to cover impact fees for certain types of development, similar to Palm Beach County's fund to encourage low-income housing or specific types
 - of businesses such as day care.)
- 4. Service delivery (Practice suggests if you agree on 1st who manages and 2nd who pays, other decisions are easy.)
- a. Fire/Rescue
- Relate the City considering a Fire/Rescue assessment for services
- Show relationship of benefit to cost in assessment methodology
- Discuss the Fire Protection Council meeting with IAFF (They want the best possible service for the area.)
- Consider Tallahassee's dual level of service structure (urban & rural), with rates classified by housing type & commercial type
- Remind all public entities, including the University of Florida and Santa Fe Community College, that they must be included or City faces possibility of court challenge
- b. Parks and recreation
- Consider a post-mortem on 1 cent sales tax referendum
- Review county's recent evaluation of its service delivery and capital needs
- Look for opportunities for consolidation
- Review projects: CSX 16th Street Rail Trail and Hogtowne Creek Greenway
- 5. Joint land acquisition and management program
- a. Evaluate opportunities for land purchase financing (local, state and federal funding sources and lobbying efforts)
- b. Consider less-than-fee strategies
- c. Identify important parcels using the KBN study
- 6. Affordable housing
- a. Develop incentives package
- b. Encourage moderate housing, especially for East Gainesville

- b. Link to property appraiser's database

- a. Present to City (or is it City-County Meeting) on Feb. 2, 1999
- b. Ask School Board and County to share cost with City
- c. Consider whether money would more productive if spent for other programs

- b. Consider esthetics vs. safety argument (Consultant recommends moving to smaller towers or put on existing structures

- b. Seek local business participation, such as banks, drugstores, grocery stores, hospitals and GRU
- c. Use public TV to inform the public

- a. Look at the impact on neighborhood redevelopment, especially in East Gainesville

- b. Use countywide economic development plan to identify industries to attract
- c. Consider recommendations from Coalition for a Livable Wage
- d. Relate feedback on handling MBE/SBE concerns
- a. Think about disparity study to determine need for formal minority business enterprise set asides (perhaps School Board, County and City should share cost)
- b. Evaluate other options to disparity study, approximately \$150,000, and consider using money for other programs
- 15. Public transportation
- a. Discuss City's grant application to link public transportation to WAGES program
- b. Examine group ridership discount fees (similar to that for University of Florida's students) for major employers, social service agencies, etc.
- c. Link to land use planning via air impact analysis

16.Urban growth boundaries

a. Discuss joint planning in the urban reserve

B. Code Enforcement

- 1. Standing committee on University of Florida-hospitals growth
- a. Create committee with the goal of stabilizing neighborhoods surrounding these high-growth nodes
- b. Consider objectives related to multifunctional impacts but focus on code enforcement issues
- c. Meet monthly to review implementation status
- d. Review University Avenue corridor study, data and recommendations may help
- e. Link to University of Florida
- f. Examine approaches used by other peer cities
- g. Involve neighborhood associations in planning
- h. Reflect on no-cost/low-cost options such as placing violators names and pictures of property on the internet
- 2. City Commission's role in Board of Adjustment's appeals
- a. Consider staff analysis of the Board of Adjustment's role
- Reviews cases and summarizes process
- Offer insight into decision-making rationale
- Includes peer-city review of commission/council role
- Answers question: Should Commission become an appellate board to Board of Adjustment?
- Offers possible solutions to improve function

C. Law Enforcement

- 1. Asked Chief to:
- a. Continue training in communication skills, 95% of confrontations are verbal
- b. Evaluate causes of crime in Gainesville
- Compare with similar cities
- List strategies for intervention
- c. Raise issue of racial slurs with Black on Black Crime Task Force
- d. Reinforce customer relations emphasis citywide
- 2. Consider community oriented policing update, scheduled in two weeks
- 3. Evaluate need for curfew
- 4. Update
- a. Decreasing complaints Installed cameras in patrol cars to monitor and protect
- b. Made strides made in affirmative action goals, currently Black females needed
- c. Adding recruitment and selection unit to increase size of applicant pool
- d. Asking community groups to help with minority recruitment
- e. Creating nuisance property unit
- f. Offering competitive salaries in City, University police paid most but experience is not a good career stepping stone
- g. Focusing on problem situations and moved some police from community policing to 'hot spot' duty because staff shortage
- h. Plan to continue with community policing and neighborhood contacts as vacant positions filled
- i. Working with SBAC on crime prevention strategies
