## Recommendations:

- Local Permit
- Code Strengthen County Hazmat Management
- Law Enforcement and other Agencies

### Permit

- Establish a permit process
- Determine threshold criteria
- Determine interval based on risk, safety record, and prevention activity
- Select an enforcement entity (city or private consultant)
- Coordinate with existing inspection programs
- Enact a local general duty clause
- Charge fees which cover the cost of inspections

## Materials Management Gode

- Add airborne (vapor or gaseous) discharges to regulation
- Add "public nuisance standard" with civil citation authority
- Create early warning standards for offsite releases
- Create a general duty clause
- Require facilities have equipment for offsite monitoring post-release

- Additional training with senior staff participation
- Hazard detection/ Self-protection
- Joint/Unified Command Operations with other agencies
