FIRST READING

Recommendation: The City Commission adopt the proposed ordinance.

The City Commission at its meeting of August 8, 2005, authorized the City Attorney to draft and the Clerk of Commission to advertise an ordinance revising the sections in Article II, Chapter 18 of the Code, regarding park policies. The Recreation and Parks Department presented an overview of the proposed changes to the Recreation and Cultural Affairs Committee at its meeting on June 16, 2005, and the Committee approved the Department's recommendations.

This ordinance requires two readings. If approved on first reading, the second and final reading will be October 24, 2005.

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Section 2. Section 18-19, City of Gainesville Code of Ordinances, is hereby amended as

12 follows:

13 Sec. 18-19. Park Hours during which parks will be closed.

Except as specifically provided or posted at the park facility, and except for tot lots, the parks (a) listed in subsections 18-18(a) and 18-18(c) shall be open for public use between the hours of 6:00 a.m. until 11:30 p.m. (this includes the buildings, pools, and ball fields located within the park boundaries), the same day and shall be closed to public use from 11:30 p.m. until 6:00 a.m. of the following day. The City Manager or designee reserves the right to program facilities located in any of the above listed parks, including but not limited to park grounds, centers, picnic pavilions and ball fields, during the open hours of operation notwithstanding the fact that public access to these facilities may be limited during programmed events. Tot lots shall be open during daylight hours only and shall be closed to public use from dusk to until dawn. The parks listed in subsection 18(b) shall be open during daylight hours only and shall be closed to public use from dusk until dawn unless otherwise posted. Daylight hours are defined as those hours between dawn and dusk. (b) Such closing hours shall not apply to activities being held pursuant to approval or permit granted by the city manager or his/her designee, city commission or director of recreation where the approval or permit specifies longer hours. an approved contract for use, signed by the City Manager or appropriate designee responsible for the park property. In these cases the fully executed contract for use shall state the

waiver of operating hours and shall be signed by the City Manager or appropriate designee.

- 1 (c) It shall be unlawful for any person to remain in any of the parks and/or facilities listed herein
- during the hours the park and/or facility is closed to public use, except with prior written approval from
- 3 <u>the City Manager or designee</u>. Such <u>unauthorized</u> presence shall be grounds for immediate arrest.
- 4 (d) If a park is designated as such by the City Commission but is not listed in section 18-18, the park
- 5 shall be posted on the grounds of the park area stating its hours of operation.
- 6 Section 3. Section 18-20, City of Gainesville Code of Ordinances, is hereby amended as
- 7 follows:

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8 Sec. 18-20. Prohibited activities.

It shall be unlawful for any person to do any of the following in any park listed in section 18-18 of this article or any other areas officially designated by the City Commission as a park and posted as such, unless specifically permitted to do so by a permit the appropriate authorization received from the City Manager or designee and issued pursuant to this article, except for activities of a governmental agency-the City of Gainesville which are undertaken within the scope of its governmental authority: (1)Reserved (2) (a)Construct, erect any hut, shanty or other shelter on park property. Park users may temporarily set up a sun/shade apparatus up to 10 ft x 10 ft in size (larger sizes upon permit issued by the City Manager or designee-may be approved by request for special events conducted in the park areas upon the issuance of a facility use agreement by the City Manager or appropriate designee in charge of that park area). Such apparatus must be made of flexible material, and any support lines which extend beyond the length and width of the covering, must be flagged for visibility and cannot be within 15 feet of any game court, sports field, or children's play equipment. No sun/shade apparatus shall remain in place overnight in any park without a special use permit or facility use agreement being issued by the City Manager or designee. All nature parks, centers and conservation areas are exempt from this provision. (3)(b) Cook foodstuff, except in designated areas where permanent facilities for such preparations are provided by the City or where such use does not on personal grills brought into the park area. Persons

- 1 may utilize grills provided by the city only for cooking in the park area. No fires or food preparation shall
- 2 <u>be allowed</u> that pose a hazard to public property or to the general public.
- 3 (4)(c) Set or stoke a fire, except for city authorized prescribed burns or those fires set or stoked in
- 4 designated areas where appropriate facilities are permanently provided by the City or where such use does
- 5 not city grills, where they are provided, and said fire shall not be allowed if it poses a hazard to public
- 6 property or to the general public;
- 7 (5)(d) Discharge or deposit human wastes, except in toilet facilities provided by the city;
- 8 (6)(e) Disturb the natural surface of the ground in any manner unless authorized in writing by the City
- 9 Manager or designee and done in accordance with a city-initiated land management activity;
- 10 (f) To allow privately owned animals to discharge or deposit waste on park property. All owners or
- others in charge of privately owned animals shall remove their waste from the park grounds, and may
- deposit animal waste in park trash receptacles;
- 13 (7)(g) Pick flowers, nuts, berries, or fruit and to or-damage or remove plants, trees, shrubs, or from any
- 14 part of the park grounds unless specifically authorized in writing by the City Manager or designee or done
- in accordance with a city-initiated land management activity;
- 16 (8)(h) Erect signs or affix signs to any tree, post, pole, fence or park facility or grounds except as
- provided by city ordinance, or through an approved facility use contract with the City Manager or
- 18 appropriate designee.
- 19 (9)(i) Drive, putt or otherwise hit a golf ball or shoot an arrow, except in areas parks specifically
- designated for these purposes;
- 21 (10)(j) To in any way disturb or remove any wildlife, animal, bird or egg located above, upon or below
- 22 the surface of the park grounds or to allow any privately owned animal to do so unless specifically
- authorized in writing by City Manager or designee;
- 24 (11)(k) Write on, draw on, paint on, or otherwise deface, damage, remove or destroy any park facility or
- any part of the park grounds;

1 To carry any firearm, weapons, explosive, or destructive device, as defined in Ch. 790, Florida 2 Statutes, either opened or concealed, onto any park property, except in parks specifically designated for 3 these uses; except as otherwise permitted by law or these ordinances; 4 (12)(m) Operate any motorized vehicle, as defined in ch. 316, Florida Statutes, in violation of city 5 ordinance on park grounds, except in areas designated by the city as parking areas, driveways, and 6 roadways. Motorists shall obey all posted speed limit and other directional signs posted within the park. 7 Authorized City personnel or contract personnel shall be allowed to drive vehicles onto park areas during 8 facility maintenance or renovation projects; 9 (13)(n) Except as otherwise provided in this Code of Ordinances, pPurchase, sell, or offer for sale, 10 possess, or consume any alcoholic beverages, illegal drugs or intoxicating substances; 11 (14)(o) Use public restrooms to shave and/or shower, unless shower facilities are specifically provided 12 for public use at that park; 13 (15)(p) Bathe or otherwise be or remain in a water or drinking fountain and/or its reservoir or to allow 14 any privately owned animal to do so; 15 (16) In parks where animals are permitted, the owner or other person in charge of the animal must clean 16 up and properly dispose of the animal's waste; 17 (17)(q) Use roller skates, roller blades or skateboards, except on bike paths, sidewalks or in areas 18 specifically designated for such purposes by the city manager, ordinance or director of recreation and 19 parks; park facilities specifically designated for this purpose; 20 (18)(r) Engage in the sale of any item on park property for any non-city sponsored function(s), except as 21 specifically authorized by permit; allowed by a facility use agreement issued by the City Manager or 22 appropriate designee or in these ordinances; 23 (19)(s) Use of any park property for non-city sponsored fundraising activities, except as authorized by 24 ordinance the City Manager or appropriate designee or in these ordinances;

1	(t) Engage in the destruction, removal or alteration of any City owned facility or equipment from any		
2	park property except as authorized by the City Manager or designee;		
3	(u) Engage in the removal, alteration or destruction of archaeological or cultural resources from any		
4	park property and water body except as authorized by the City Manager or designee. For purposes of this		
5	article "archaeological or cultural resources" means associated physical remnants and features contained		
6	in the ground including but not limited to artifacts, fossils, bones, shell mounds, or primitive culture		
7	facilities or items;		
8	(v) Engage in the removal, destruction or harassment of animals and plants from or on parklands,		
9	except for authorized research efforts, as authorized by the City Manager or appropriate designee; and		
10	(w) Engage in the introduction of plants or animals onto park lands unless authorized by the City		
11	Manager or appropriate designee.		
12	Section 4. Section 18-21, City of Gainesville Code of Ordinances, is hereby created and		
13	added to read as follows:		
14	Sec. 18.21 Land Management Provisions		
15	Unless otherwise specified herein and in addition to the restrictions stated at section 18-20 of this		
16	Code, the following land management provisions shall be applicable to the parks listed at subsection 18-		
17	18(b), nature parks, centers and conservation areas:		
18	(a) Nature parks, centers and conservation areas shall be open to the public; however, the activities		
19	established by the City Manager or designee for each park shall be compatible with the protection of the		
20	natural resources for each individual park and shall be posted at each park. Nature parks, centers and		
21	conservation areas shall be closed to the public when, due to emergency conditions or activities		
22	undertaken by the federal, state or local government for maintenance of such areas, closure is necessary to		
23	protect such lands or to protect the health, safety and welfare of the public.		

- 1 Hiking, defined as travel by foot, is permitted in nature parks, centers and conservation areas only 2 on designated trails, established roads and in firebreaks, and shall not occur in areas posted as restricted to 3 access. 4 Bicycling is permitted at certain nature parks, centers and conservation areas and these parks will 5 be so posted. Within a park permitting bicycling, bicycling shall be only permitted on trails or areas so 6 designated within the individual park area. 7 Horseback riding is permitted only from the north parking area of Boulware Springs Nature Park (d) 8 to the Gainesville-Hawthorne State Trail unless otherwise authorized in writing by the City Manager or 9 designee. 10 Hunting or trapping is prohibited in any nature park, center or conservation area, except where 11 specifically authorized in writing by the City Manager or designee for the purposes of scientific study or 12 the removal of nuisance species and as regulated by the State. 13 Dogs are permitted in nature parks, centers and conservation areas (except where otherwise 14 posted) provided that such animals shall be leashed at all times. When authorized in writing by the City 15 Manager or designee, other domestic animals may be permitted at Morningside Nature Center and at 16 nature parks, centers and conservation areas. The owner or other person responsible for the animal shall 17 clean up and properly dispose of the animal's waste as stated in section 18-20. 18 (g) Swimming is prohibited at all nature parks, centers and conservation areas except in areas posted 19 for swimming. 20 Fishing is permitted at Palm Point Nature Park and Colclough Pond Nature Park in compliance
- The disposal of oil, gasoline or other hazardous substances is prohibited at all nature parks,
- 23 centers and conservation areas.

with the guidelines established in state law.

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24 (j) The use of metal detectors is prohibited in all nature parks, centers and conservation areas.

1	(k) Concessions may be allowed in certain nature parks, centers and conservations areas, if they are		
2	determined to be appropriate to that natural area and are approved in writing by the City Manager or		
3	designee. Appropriate to the natural area is described as:		
4	(1) The concession is necessary to fulfill a need in the interest of the public and will assist		
5	the City in providing public use of nature parks, centers and conservation areas;		
6	(2) The concession will be open to the public;		
7	(3) The concession will be economically feasible for the City;		
8	(4) The concession will be compatible with the protection of the natural resources and the		
9	management goals for that land as stated in the management plan; and		
10	(5) The concession will not result in an unfair advantage over existing businesses that		
11	provide similar services in the area.		
12	(1) Research may be permitted in nature parks, centers and conservation areas if said research is		
13	compatible with the protection of the natural resources and the management goals for that land as stated		
14	in the land management plan for that property and when approved in writing by the City Manager or		
15	designee.		
16	Section 5. Section 18-22, City of Gainesville Code of Ordinances, is hereby created to read		
17	as follows:		
18	Sec. 18.22 Archaeological Discovery.		
19	Any person discovering archaeological or cultural resources on nature parks, centers and conservation		
20	areas shall immediately notify the City Manager or designee of such discovery.		
21	Section 6. It is the intention of the City Commission that the provisions of Sections 1 through 5 of		
22	this ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Gainesville,		
23	Florida, and that the Sections and Paragraphs of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered in order		
24	to accomplish such intentions.		

1	Section 7. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is held to be invalid or				
2	unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, then said holding shall in no way affect the				
3	validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.				
4	Section 8. All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, in conflict herewith are to the extent of suc				
5	conflict hereby repealed.				
6	Section 9. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final adoption.
