WHEREAS, the United Nations Association of the USA, Gainesville Chapter, is committed to educating and mobilizing our local communities to build a stronger network of citizens and leaders to create a more prosperous, just and sustainable world; and

WHEREAS, the United Nations Association of the USA, Gainesville Chapter, has declared "Youth and the United Nations: the World We Want" as its theme for the 2014 United Nations Day commemoration; and

WHEREAS, Doctor Anita Spring and Doctor Vilma Fuentes have jointly been appointed Chair of the UN Day Committee in Gainesville to work with local UNA-USA members and community leaders to organize events and activities in celebration of UN Day and to educate citizens about the UNs work.
