EARLY VOTING

An ordinance of the City of Gainesville amending Chapter 9 Elections by amending Sections 9-5 and creating Section 9-6.5 by providing early voting in municipal elections; providing directions to the codifier; providing a severability clause; providing a repealing clause and providing an immediate

effective date.

**RECOMMENDATION:** The City Commission adopt the proposed ordinance.

On September 12, 2005, the City Commission authorized the City Attorney to draft, and the Clerk of the Commission to advertise an ordinance that would provide early voting for regular elections.

Florida Law requires early voting be made available in State elections, which consist of primary elections, special primary elections, special elections, general elections, and presidential preference primary elections. Municipal elections are not included in the list of elections for which early voting is mandatory. Recently, the legislature provided that "municipalities may provide early voting in municipal elections that are not held in conjunction with county or state elections". It is up to the individual municipalities to decide whether they will provide for early voting and for what period of time.

This ordinance will provide early voting for regular elections. The elections will last for a period of seven days before the first election and for seven days before the runoff election, if one is held. Early voting will be conducted only at the Office of the Supervisor of Elections.

11	of general circulation notifying the public of this proposed ordinance and of a Public Hearing in
12	the City Commission Auditorium in City Hall, City of Gainesville; and
13	WHEREAS, a Public Hearing was held pursuant to the published notice described at
14	which hearing the parties in interest and all others had an opportunity to be and were, in fact,
15	heard;
16	NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE
17	CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA;
18	Section 1. Chapter 9, Section 9-5 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Gainesville is
19	amended to read as follows:
20	Sec. 9-5. Mayor to issue proclamation; contents; publication.
21	Thirty days prior to any and all elections for mayor or commissioners the mayor shall
22	issue a proclamation calling the election. The proclamation shall specify what officers are to be
23	elected, the length of time the officers are to serve and the time and date of holding the election,
24	including any provision for early voting as allowed in this Chapter. Such proclamation shall be
25	published once in a newspaper of general circulation published in the city.
26	Section 2. Chapter 9, Section 9-6.5 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Gainesville
27	is created to read as follows:

	Sec.	9-6.5	. Early	Voting.

2	(a) As a convenience to the voter, early voting shall be allowed in municipal general
3	elections that are not held in conjunction with county or state elections. The provisions of this
4	section shall apply only to municipal general elections that are not held in conjunction with
5	county or state elections. Early voting in municipal elections that are held in conjunction with
6	county or state elections shall be governed as provided by state law.
7	(b) This section shall not apply to municipal special elections that are not held in
8	conjunction with county or state elections.
9	(c) The early voting site for early voting pursuant to this section shall be the main office
10	of the supervisor of elections of Alachua County, Florida, and the supervisor shall designate an
11	early voting area.
12	(d) Early voting pursuant to this section shall begin on the 8th day before the general
13	election and end on the 2nd day before the general election. If a runoff general election is
14	necessary, early voting pursuant to this section shall begin on the 8th day before the runoff
15	general election and end on the 2nd day before the runoff general election. Early voting pursuant
16	to this section shall be provided for 8 hours per weekday and 8 hours in the aggregate each
17	weekend during the applicable period. The early voting site shall open no sooner than 7 a.m. and
18	close no later than 7 p.m. on each applicable day.
19	Section 3. It is the intention of the City Commission that Section 1 and Section 2 of this
20	ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Gainesville Code of Ordinance, of the City of
21	Gainesville, Florida, and that the Sections and Paragraphs of this ordinance may be renumbered or
22	relettered in order to accomplish such intentions.
