
President Eisenhower Two deeply held convictions unite us in common purpose:

Matagalpa, Nicaragua



- Founded in 1988
- First delegation to Matagalpa led by Robert Hutchinson, Paul Doughty, Dr. Jape Taylor and Matthew Kalishman
- Dr. Taylor returned with medical students and supplies
- Water treatment plant built with discarded GRU equipment provided potable water to Matagalpa
- Casa Materna "Mary Ann Jackman" clinic and obstetric center has helped over 14,000 poor rural women deliver healthy babies.

Kfar Saba, Israel Qalqilya, PNA



- Unique three-way relationship founded in 1998 by resolution of the Gainesville City Commission
- First delegation to Kfar Saba and Qalqilya led by Mayor Pegeen Hanrahan in 1998
