

A. Quinn Jones, Sr. (1893-1997)

- Champion of quality education for African-Americans
 - 1921-1923 Union Academy
 - 1923 1957 1st Principal of Lincoln High School
- Community Leader
 - Service in various organizations







- Historical Marker
 - State of Florida granted a historical marker in 2009
 - Listed in the National Register of Historic Places in 2010.
 - One of the highest honors given for historically significant people.
- Presidential Recognition
 - Recognized for work on Selective Service Advisory Board



State & Local Significance

- Lincoln High School expanded to offer full high school diplomas (1925)
- 2nd Negro high school in FL to become accredited (1926)
- DOE approved High School Teacher training program (1931)
- Responsible for educating many of the Florida's African-American teachers (i.e. Mickle, McPherson)
- Leader in school resource and facility equality



The Museum

The purpose of modern museums is to collect, preserve, interpret, and display items of cultural, artistic, or scientific significance for the education of the public

 No longer just preserve history or tell story of a single population (American Alliance of Museums)



 - \$15,000 from private funding


