Peer City Report - Conclusions

- Generally, link exists between size of a community (land area/population) and the outcomes/levels of economic activity (incomes/tax base);
- Generally, link exists between diversity in economic base and incomes;
- Generally, University communities exhibit higher than normal levels of poverty due to students and economic stratification;

Peer City Report - Conclusions

- Generally, relative to Peer Cities the City of Gainesville has access to fewer resources (in terms of tax base) to fund public priorities;
- Generally, the data documenting the local economic impact of University research dollars and commercialization efforts is not clearly reported;
- Most, if not all, of the analyzed Peer Cities are attempting to capture University generated tech transfer and commercialization activity.

Peer City Report - Recommendations

- (1) The City Commission is encouraged to adopt three peer cities (communities) to include in future benchmarking efforts (these would be in addition to the Florida cities of Orlando, Tampa, Tallahassee);
- (2) The City Commission directs ED staff to incorporate 2004 and 2005 ED Summit recommendations into ED Department work program;

2004 Economic Development Summit Recommendations

- Aggressively begin the process of diversifying the economy.
- Maintain a comprehensive, well financed economic development program.
- Reduce costs and time for primary employers as much as possible.
- Best opportunity - Grow your own.
- Be prepared to offer incentives.

2005 Economic Development Summit Recommendations

- Stress World Class Science; Develop Capital and Management Resources
- Work to develop a supportive culture, networks and politics
- Seed innovation
- Emphasize follow-up and capture
- Assist with coordination

Peer City Report - Recommendations

- (3) City Commission is encouraged to support efforts at diversifying the local economic base through:
 - (a) facilitation of the community's "grow your own capacity" through partnership with the University, Community College and private sector partners;
 - (b) facilitation of sectors serving basic industries (manufacturing, production, assembly) of goods
- Note: Facilitation includes assistance with provision of inventory; a conducive regulatory environment; supportive culture and network; and where necessary, a willingness to fill gaps.

Peer City Report - Recommendations

- (4) City Commission is encouraged to analyze fiscal impact of land use and zoning regimen on tax base as well as land development code for impacts and transparency;
- (5) City Commission is encouraged to consider improvements and maintenance of infrastructure within the context of supporting a sound economic development foundation.
