DISCUSSION OF PENDING REFERRALS

110683. Alcohol Sales and Consumption Outdoors Downtown (B)

The basis of this referral is an interest in addressing increasing demand for outdoor events in the downtown area that allow the sale and consumption of alcohol on City property.

Explanation: After discussing this referral at several previous meetings, on February 28, 2013 the Committee approved a motion to support an exception for alcohol sales and consumption on Lot 10 and adjacent streets determined by City staff and to keep the broader issue in Committee.

On February 28, 2013, the Committee also took action on a related referral for Special Event Permits for Bars concerning the interest of businesses to provide for the temporary outdoor sales and consumption of alcoholic beverages beyond University of Florida home football games. The Committee approved a motion to direct the City Attorney to prepare an ordinance to expand the extension of premises Citywide and allow up to 4 Special Event Permits per year providing extension of premises for alcohol above and beyond UF home football games. This was approved by the City Commission on March 21, 2013.

On March 21, 2013, the City Commission approved the Committee's recommendation and directed the City Attorney to draft an ordinance allowing the use of Lot 10 as an outdoor venue allowing the sale and consumption of alcohol for the Fest Musical event to sell beer only.

In reviewing these requested changes to the Alcohol Ordinance, the City Attorney's Office and staff also reviewed the history of changes to the ordinance and determined that a more practical approach would be to re-write the Alcohol Ordinance to address these ongoing issues in a more holistic fashion. The City Attorney's Office and staff met several times to develop the proposed draft ordinance. The draft ordinance was finalized on August 13, 2013.

City staff provided the draft ordinance to those interested in the subject and met with GDOT at their September 10, 2013 meeting. These stakeholders were informed of the Committee's meeting on the topic.

The Committee will continue to discuss the broader referral issues at the September 25, 2013 and review the draft ordinance update provided by the City Attorney's Office.

Fiscal Note: The City will need to recover costs from event organizers for services provided to support outdoor special events downtown. Even with cost-recovery, as more events take place downtown requiring City support, staff resources may become stretched.

RECOMMENDATION

The Public Safety Committee discuss the draft ordinance, make changes as appropriate and provide a recommendation to the full City Commission.
