1: Project Background



Project Background



 November 2021: The City partnered with BerryDunn to assist with performing a cost-of-service analysis for the Department of Sustainable Development Neighborhood Enhancement Division.



 November 2021 – March 2022: BerryDunn met on multiple occasions with City staff and stakeholders, performed the cost-of-service analysis, and developed a financial and operational scenario for the Residential Rental Unit Program.



 March 2022: BerryDunn compiled all staff and stakeholder feedback, financial and operational analysis methodologies, and findings and recommendations into a final project report.

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• April 2022: BerryDunn presented findings and recommendation to the City Commission for consideration and acceptance.

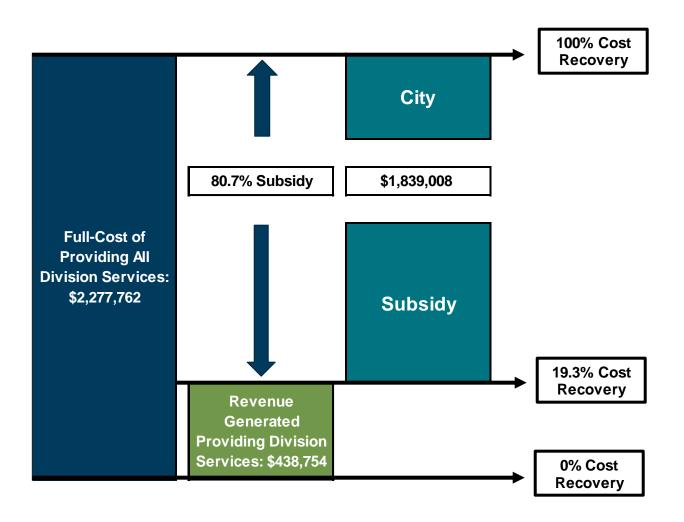

Summary of Findings – Neighborhood Enhancement Division





Revenue: \$438,754

Expense: \$2,277,762

Subsidy: \$1,839,008

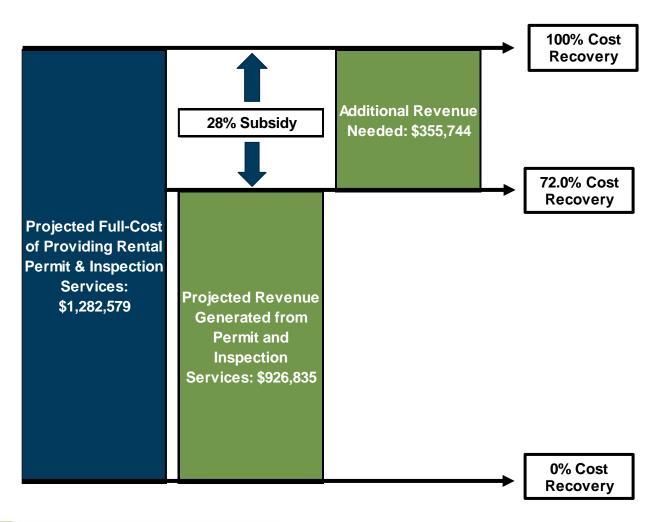
• Cost Recovery: 19.3%

 Residential Rental Unit Program currently accounts for \$376,319 (85.8%) of annual revenue.



Summary of Findings – Residential Rental Unit Program





- Current Permit Fee: \$122
- Projected Revenue: \$926,835
- Projected Expense: \$1,282,579
- Subsidy: \$355,744
- Cost Recovery: **72.0**%
- Full-Cost Permit Fee: \$155



3: Future Fee Levels & Policy Considerations



Proposed Considerations



- Residential Rental Unit Program: The City should consider increasing the current Program permit fee from \$122.00 to \$155.00.
- Cost Recovery Rates: Cost recovery rates for projected scenarios:
 - Division baseline: 19.3%. Projected to increase to 35.5% should the City assume full management of the Program at current permit fee level.
 - Division baseline: 35.5%%. Projected to increase to 44.1% should the City increase the Program permit fee from \$122.00 to \$155.00.
- Annual Fee Updates: The Division should review all fees and charges annually and consider adjustments as needed.
