PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the annual Florida Great American Cleanup Day in Alachua County coordinated by Keep Alachua County Beautiful will be observed April 8, 2000; and

WHEREAS, GLAD Bags, Publix, Keep Florida Beautiful, the City of Gainesville, Alachua County, the Gainesville Sun, KTK 98.5, Boone Waste Management, Inc., of Florida, Big Red Waste, CH2M Hill, WUST-TV5 and Pepsi sponsor the Cleanup along with many, many other contributors; and

WHEREAS, last year 6,482 volunteers representing 114 groups picked up 205 tons of trash and recyclables with a fiscal benefit to the community of \$176,079.27; and

WHEREAS, there were lasting reminder projects such as trees, shrubs and flowers planted, homes cleaned, painted and landscaped, illegal dumps cleaned up and permanently cordoned off, bridges and walls painted, and graffiti removed; and

WHEREAS, Keep Alachua County Beautiful is dedicated to maintaining and improving the livability of the community environment; and


WHEREAS, the Florida Great American Cleanup Day will encourage citizens to maintain a cleaner and more beautiful environment, and involves all concerned citizens in promoting community pride throughout the Gainesville/Alachua County community.
