A RESOLUTION SPECIFYING THAT ONE HALF OF SURCHARGES IMPOSED ON WATER AND WASTEWATER CONNECTION FEES BE USED FOR EXPANSION OF THE WATER, WASTEWATER, OR RECLAIMED WATER SYSTEM AND DESCRIBING THE IDENTIFICATION AND PRIORITIZATION OF SUCH PROJECTS.

WHEREAS, the City of Gainesville owns, operates, and maintains a utility system which provides electric power, water, wastewater, natural gas and telecommunication services to a region within and beyond the municipal boundaries of the City; and

WHEREAS, the City of Gainesville charges surcharges on water, wastewater, and electric service provided beyond the municipal boundaries of the City; and

WHEREAS, effective October 1, 2001 by the adoption of Ordinance No. 001622 such surcharges apply to all water and wastewater connection charges.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA:

Effective October 1, 2002, one-half of surcharges collected on
water and wastewater connection fees pursuant to Ordinance No.
001622 shall be used to assist in the expansion of water,
wastewater and reclaimed water facilities in the incorporated area
of the City of Gainesville.

- The primary intent of such water and wastewater system
   expansions shall be to enhance the provision of these services to
   areas of the City where they would otherwise be cost-prohibitive.
- 3. The City Manager and General Manager for Utilities or their respective designees shall jointly identify and prioritize water, wastewater and reclaimed water facilities to be expanded using this source of funding in accordance with these guidelines.
- 4. It is the intent of the City Commission that funds expended hereunder:
  - A. may only be used to fund on-site or off-site facilities that are to be dedicated and accepted by the City for ownership and maintenance;
  - B. A. are to be used to assist with the payment of costs associated with the extension of, construction of, or connections to the City's water, wastewater, or reclaimed water systems, including costs for on-site plumbing modifications;
  - C. B. will be used only to make central water, wastewater, and reclaimed water service available to residential areas;
  - D. C. should be allocated as follows:
  - 20% Health/Safety/Environment projects to address public health, safety, or environmental issues;

20% - Affordable Housing – projects to provide central water/wastewater service to existing or proposed affordable housing, existing housing will be given priority over proposed housing. Owner occupied housing will be given priority over rental housing;

60% - Programmed Extensions – projects to make central water, wastewater, and reclaimed water available to every resident of the City.

5. Programmed Water and Wastewater Extensions will be prioritized as follows, and each category will be completed before moving to the next category:

6. In the event that percentages identified above are not encumbered annually for Health/Safety/Environment or for Affordable Housing, such funds shall be used the subsequent year for the Programmed Extensions.

# III. Comparison of Outside Funding for On-Site Plumbing with Use of Surcharge Funds

The resolution contains a prioritization schedule for making programmed extensions. Connections will first be made to provide water service to residents in CDBG areas where water distribution lines already exist (i.e. no extension of water distribution lines is necessary, and the only off-site cost is connection charges). Once these residents are served the program will be extended to the next priority, etc. Table 2 presents the estimated timeline for making water and

wastewater connections for the first three priority areas under two different scenarios: (1) Outside funding is secured and used to fund on-site costs, and (2) No outside funding is received, and surcharge funds are used to pay for on-site costs. The lack of availability of outside funding will increase the timeline for providing service.
