

GAINESVILLE – The City of Gainesville's Department of Cultural Affairs is proud to announce its 20th Annual Downtown Festival & Art Show poster as a national winner of the "Sunshine Artist Magazine's Sixth Annual Poster Contest."

The 2001 poster received recognition as the "Best Representation of an Area," portraying historic downtown Gainesville late in the afternoon. The scene, which focuses on the Hippodrome State Theatre and Union Street Station, draws the attention of the viewer with its vibrant colors and conveys a hint of familiarity and warmth.
