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ORDINANCE NO. 130103

An ordinance amending the Capital Improvements Element of the City of Gainesville Comprehensive Plan by amending Policy 1.2.1 and by updating *Table 14: 5-Year Schedule of Capital Improvements (FY 12/13 – 16/17)*; providing directions to the City Manager; providing a severability clause; providing a repealing clause; and providing an effective date.

WHEREAS, Section 163.3167, Florida Statutes, requires local governments to maintain a comprehensive plan to guide future development and growth; and

WHEREAS, Section 163.3177, Florida Statutes, requires local governments to include as part of the comprehensive plan a capital improvements element that considers the need for and the location of public facilities and encourages the efficient use of such facilities; and

WHEREAS, Section 163.3177(3)(a), Florida Statutes, requires local governments to maintain in the capital improvements element of the comprehensive plan a 5-year capital improvements schedule that identifies projects necessary to maintain and achieve the adopted levels of service for the 5-year planning period; and

WHEREAS, Section 163.3177(3)(b), Florida Statutes, requires local governments to annually review the capital improvements element of the comprehensive plan; and

WHEREAS, notice of an update to the 5-Year Schedule of Capital Improvements in the Capital Improvements Element of the City of Gainesville Comprehensive Plan was given as required by law and a public hearing was then held by the City Plan Board on June 27, 2013; and

WHEREAS, notice of an amendment to the Capital Improvements Element of the

1 City of Gainesville Comprehensive Plan to correct a policy reference in Policy 1.2.1 was
2 given as required by law and a public hearing was then held by the City Plan Board on
3 December 2, 2013; and

4 **WHEREAS**, pursuant to law, an advertisement no less than two columns wide by 10
5 inches long was placed in a newspaper of general circulation and provided the public with at
6 least seven (7) days' advance notice of the first public hearing (transmittal stage) for this
7 ordinance to be held in the City Hall Auditorium located on the first floor of City Hall in the
8 City of Gainesville; and

9 **WHEREAS**, pursuant to law, after the public hearing at the transmittal stage, the City
10 of Gainesville transmitted copies of this proposed amendment to the reviewing agencies and
11 any other local government unit or state agency that requested same; and

12 **WHEREAS**, a second advertisement no less than two columns wide by 10 inches
13 long was placed in the aforesaid newspaper and provided the public with at least five (5)
14 days' advance notice of the second public hearing (adoption stage) for this ordinance to be
15 held in the City Hall Auditorium located on the first floor of City Hall in the City of
16 Gainesville; and

17 **WHEREAS**, the public hearings were held pursuant to the published notices
18 described above at which hearings the parties in interest and all others had an opportunity to
19 be and were, in fact, heard; and

20 **WHEREAS**, prior to adoption of this ordinance the City Commission has considered
21 any written comments received concerning this plan amendment.

1 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF**
2 **THE CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA:**

3 **Section 1.** Policy 1.2.1 of the Capital Improvements Element of the City of
4 Gainesville Comprehensive Plan is amended as stated below. Except as amended herein, the
5 remainder of Objective 1.2 and its Policies remain in full force and effect.

6 Policy 1.2.1 The City shall adopt the following LOS standards for public facilities within
7 its jurisdiction as indicated in the below listed elements of its Comprehensive
8 Plan:

- 10 Transportation Mobility: Objective 1.1 and associated policies
- 11 Stormwater: Policy 1.1.1
- 12 Potable Water & Water Supply: Policy 1.1.1 and Policy 1.1.3
- 13 Wastewater: Policy 1.1.2
- 14 Recreation: Policy 1.1.1
- 15 Solid Waste: Policy 1.4.1
- 16 Public School Facilities: Policy 2.3.1 ~~2.2.1~~
- 17

18 **Section 2.** *Table 14: 5-Year Schedule of Capital Improvements* contained in the
19 Capital Improvements Element of the City of Gainesville Comprehensive Plan is amended as
20 shown in Exhibit “A”, which is attached hereto and made a part hereof as if set forth in full.

21 **Section 3.** It is the intent of the City Commission that the provisions of Sections 1
22 and 2 of this ordinance shall become and be made a part of the City of Gainesville
23 Comprehensive Plan.

24 **Section 4.** Within ten (10) working days of the transmittal (first) hearing, the City
25 Manager or designee is authorized and directed to transmit this plan amendment and
26 appropriate supporting data and analyses to the reviewing agencies and to any other local
27 government or governmental agency that has filed a written request for same with the City.

1 Within ten (10) working days of the adoption (second) hearing, the City Manager or
2 designee is authorized and directed to transmit this plan amendment and appropriate
3 supporting data and analyses to the state land planning agency and any other agency or local
4 government that provided timely comments to the City.

5 **Section 5.** The City Manager or designee is authorized and directed to make the
6 necessary changes to the City of Gainesville Comprehensive Plan in order to fully implement
7 this ordinance. The City Manager or designee is authorized to correct any typographical
8 errors that do not affect the intent of this ordinance.

9 **Section 6.** If any word, phrase, clause, paragraph, section or provision of this
10 ordinance or the application hereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid or
11 unconstitutional, such finding shall not affect the other provisions or applications of this
12 ordinance that can be given effect without the invalid or unconstitutional provision or
13 application, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are declared severable.

14 **Section 7.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are to the extent
15 of such conflict hereby repealed on the effective date of this plan amendment.

16 **Section 8.** This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption;
17 however, the effective date of this amendment to the City of Gainesville Comprehensive
18 Plan, if the amendment is not timely challenged, shall be 31 days after the state land planning
19 agency notifies the City that the plan amendment package is complete in accordance with
20 Section 163.3184, F.S. If timely challenged, this amendment shall become effective on the
21 date the state land planning agency or the Administration Commission enters a final order

1 determining this adopted amendment to be in compliance with Chapter 163, F.S. No
2 development orders, development permits, or land uses dependent on this amendment may be
3 issued or commenced before this plan amendment has become effective.
