Ordinance No. 0-01-36

An ordinance of the City of Gainesville, Florida, amending Division 5 of Chapter 2 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Gainesville relating to the General Employees Pension Plan; relating to final average earnings; providing directions to the codifier; providing a severability clause; providing a repealing

clause; and providing an immediate effective date.

Recommendation: The City Commission adopt the proposed ordinance.

On June 11, 2001, the City Commission approved the recommendation by the City Manager, authorizing the City Attorney's Office to prepare and the Clerk of the Commission to advertise an ordinance amending the definition of final average earnings in the General Employees Pension Plan relating to certain circumstances in which a break in service has occurred.

A preliminary evaluation by the Plan's actuary anticipated no fiscal impact associated with the proposed amendments. The ATU and CWA bargaining units have been notified of this change.

14	Section 1. Subsections (3) and (4) of the definition for "Final average earnings" in					
15	section 2-521 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Gainesville are created and added					
16	to read as follows:					
17	Sec. 2-521. Definitions.					
18	Final average earnings shall mean:					
19	(3) If the employment of a member is terminated and such former member,					
20	who is not a retiree or receiving a termination benefit (or whose termination benefit was					
21	cashed out under section 2-526(a)(3)), is subsequently re-employed by the city as an					
22	eligible member, such member's final average earnings shall be calculated as follows,					
23	except as otherwise required by subsections (1) and (2) of this definition: The months of					
24	employment immediately preceding the termination shall be deemed to be consecutive					
25	with the months of employment earned after the member's re-employment.					
26	(4) If a continuously employed member ceases to earn eligible service for					
27	more than one month during the period of such employment and subsequently begins to					

1	again earn el	again earn eligible service, such member's final average earnings shall be calculated as						
2	follows, except as otherwise required by subsections (1) and (2) of this definition: The							
3	months of employment during which eligible service were earned shall be deemed							
4	consecutive.							
5	Section 2.	It is the intention of the City Commission that the provisions of Section 1						
6	of this Ordin	inance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City						
7	of Gainesville, Florida, and that the Sections and Paragraphs of this Ordinance may be							
8	renumbered or relettered in order to accomplish such intentions.							
9	Section 3. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is held to be							
10	invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, then said holding shall							
11	in no way affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.							
12	Section 4.	All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are to the extent						
13	of such conf	n conflict hereby repealed.
