



PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, 142 years after J. Sterling Morton first proposed to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a special day be set aside for the planting of trees, we continue his vision with our own tree planting ceremony; and

WHEREAS, the National Arbor Day Foundation has certified that in 2013, Gainesville met the requirements of the "Tree City USA" program for the 30th consecutive year; and

WHEREAS, the City Beautification Board, the Four Seasons Garden Club, the Planning and Development Services Department and the Parks, Recreation and Cultural Affairs Department have invited the community to join in a celebration of Arbor Day; and

WHEREAS, 60 shade trees have been planted along Depot Avenue and South Main Street in honor of this occasion; two trees for every year Gainesville has been a Tree City USA; and

WHEREAS, this is the 30-year celebration as a "Tree City USA" so, in addition, the City of Gainesville has planted in total 68 trees due to our passion with this honor.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Edward B. Braddy, by the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Gainesville, do hereby proclaim January 16, 2014 as

in the City of Gainesville and invite all our citizens to join me in celebrating Gainesville's wonderful tree canopy.
