STRIKING OR INTERFERING WITH LAW ENFORCEMENT

**ANIMALS** 

An ordinance of the City of Gainesville, Florida, creating a new section 17-11 related to striking or interfering with law enforcement animals, providing for penalties; providing directions to the codifier; providing for severability; providing a repealing clause; and providing an immediate

effective date.

<u>RECOMMENDATION:</u> The City Commission adopt the proposed ordinance.

The City Commission at its meeting of June 12, 2000 requested the Clerk of the Commission to advertise and the City Attorney to draft an ordinance that would provide for enforcement of an individual who intentionally strikes or interferes with a Mounted Unit animal.

Current Florida State Statute does not allow for law enforcement to cite an individual who intentionally strikes or interferes with a Mounted Unit animal while the law enforcement animal is in the performance of its duties. There are provisions in State Statute that prohibit these actions for Police K-9's and ultimately, the police department will seek a language change through the next State legislative process for consideration. Until that time, a City ordinance would allow law enforcement officers the ability to gite for this offense.

10 11	WHEREAS, at least 10 days notice has been given once prior to adoption by publication			
12	in a newspaper of general circulation notifying the public of this proposed ordinance and of a			
13	Public Hearing in the City Commission Auditorium in City Hall, City of Gainesville; and			
14	WHEREAS, a Public Hearing was held pursuant to the published notice described at			
15	which hearing the parties in interest and all others had an opportunity to be and were, in fact,			
16	heard;			
17	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE			
18	CITY OF GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA:			
19	Section 1. A new section 17-11 is created and added to the Code of Ordinances of the City			
20	of Gainesville, to read as follows:			
21	Sec. 17-11. Reserved. Striking or interfering with law enforcement animals.			
22	a) As used in this section, the following words shall have the meanings indicated:			
23	(1) Law enforcement animal means an animal, including but not limited to a dog or			
24	horse, that is owned or leased by the Gainesville Police Department for the principal purpose of			
25	aiding in i) the detection of criminal activity; ii) the enforcement of laws; iii) the apprehension of			
26	offenders; or iv) traffic or crowd control or such other activities directed by the Chief of Police.

1	(2) Interfere with means any activity intended to distract the law enforcement animal		
2	from or hinder it in the performance of its duties, including but not limited to throwing or waving		
3	objects at, chasing, flashing laser pointer beams, calling, blocking or any similar activity.		
4	(3) In the performance of its duties means a law enforcement animal is i) on duty		
5	for the Gainesville Police Department; ii) in an off-duty capacity, including working at an approved		
6	off duty/extra duty event for a contracted entity for law enforcement services; or iii) at an approved		
7	non-pay volunteer event.		
8	b) It shall be unlawful for any person to knowingly or intentionally strike or interfere		
9	with a law enforcement animal while said law enforcement animal is in the performance of its duties.		
10	c) It shall be a defense to subsection (b) if the accused person was engaged in a training		
11	activity or discipline, for the law enforcement animal, and acted as an employee or agent of the		
12	Gainesville Police Department.		
13	d) Any person who violates any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty		
14	of a municipal ordinance violation and shall be subject to fine or imprisonment as provided by section		
15	1-9 of the Gainesville Code of Ordinances.		
16	e) In addition to any other penalties prescribed herein, the court may order a person		
17	convicted of striking or interfering with a law enforcement animal for reimbursement of veterinary		
18	bills, costs of retraining and temporary loss of use and replacement costs if the law enforcement		
19 🗵	animal is killed, disabled or otherwise unable to perform its duties as a result of striking or		
20	interference.		
21	Section 2. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is held to be invalid or		
22	unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, then said holding shall in no way affect the		
23	validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.
