I understand that Earnestine Gardner spoke with you about the project we are attempting with the Sickle Cell community from ours and surrounding counties that are served by Shands Children's Hospital. As you may or may not know Streetlight is a new program at SCH that specifically focuses on adolescents with critical, terminal or chronic illnesses. Many of these young people are clinically depressed because beyond the normal issues of being a teenager they are having to deal with cancer or sickle cell and the isolation and peer abandonment that follow. For some time now there has been a problem pulling the sickle cell community together, but we think that the plan we are working on has a good chance of success because our team of 50 UF volunteers (on the Streetlight team) have formed relationships with these sickle cell adolescents over the past year. Through their encouragement and work on this project we have a good chance of success and getting a large turnout of the SC community on April 12, 3 – 5PM.

I have included with this letter our outline proposal, which is what Earnestine said you needed to help us find a location for this event. We hope to have 50 – 100 in attendance – all counted – volunteers, teens and their parents. We would like to hang a large graffiti banner on the wall for all to sign in with their own personal touch. We'd like to put up other decorations, and will certainly comply with whatever standards there are for putting things up – like sticky tack instead of tape? We have a hard working group of Pre-Med students that will help with set up and take down and I will personally supervise everything that happens.

There is no money for this project, which is probably why it has not been attempted before, but we are determined to do whatever is necessary to raise money for gas vouchers, so that families can participate.
