Ordinance No. 0-05-46; Petition 82TCH-04 PB

An ordinance of the City of Gainesville, Florida, amending subsections (g) and (h) of section 30-332 of the City of Gainesville Land Development Code; providing criteria for the reduction in number of bicycle parking spaces required where evidence supports a lesser need for bicycle parking; providing a severability clause; providing a repealing clause; and providing an immediate effective

date.

<u>Recommendation</u>: The City Commission (1) approve Petition 82TCH-04 PB and (2) adopt the proposed ordinance.

# COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT STAFF REPORT

During the discussion of changes to the off-street parking regulations in Article IX of Division 2 that were adopted in 2003 bicycle parking requirements were discussed but not revised. Concern was expressed that some uses may be required to have a larger number of bicycle parking spaces than the particular circumstances of the location, use and other factors may justify. The parking requirement for motor vehicles can be reduced based upon the criteria listed in Section 30-332(g). There are currently no provisions (other than for mixed-use districts) for the reduction of bicycle parking requirements. This proposed text amendment to allow bicycle parking reduction is based on Section 30-332(g), modified to be specific to bicycles and issues involved with bicycle parking.

This petition started originally as a referral from the City Commission to the Public Works Committee. After Public Works Committee recommendations were reported back to the City Commission, the item was referred to the Community Development Committee for further discussion and recommendations. Their recommendation was that the text amendment include language to ensure that the reduction would never decrease the number of bicycle spaces to less than 50 percent of the required amount.

The Plan Board heard the petition and recommended that it be approved.

Public notice was published in the Gainesville Sun on March 1, 2005. The Plan Board held a public hearing March 17, 2005. Planning Division staff recommended that the Plan Board approve the petition. The Plan Board recommended that the City Commission approve Petition 82TCH-04 PB. Plan Board vote 5-0.

<u>Petition 82TCH-04 PB</u>, City Plan Board. Amend the City of Gainesville Land Development Code, Section 30-332, to add language allowing a reduction in the number of required bicycle parking spaces.

## Recommendation

Planning Division staff recommends approval of Petition 82TCH-04 PB.

#### **Explanation**

During the discussion of changes to the off-street parking regulations in Article IX of Division 2 that were adopted in 2003 bicycle parking requirements were discussed but not revised. Concern was expressed that some uses may be required to have a larger number of bicycle parking spaces than the particular circumstances of the location, use and other factors may justify. The parking requirement for motor vehicles can be reduced based upon the criteria listed in Section 30-332(g). There are currently no provisions (other than for mixed-use districts) for the reduction of bicycle parking requirements. This proposed text amendment to allow bicycle parking reduction is based on Section 30-332(g), modified to be specific to bicycles and issues involved with bicycle parking.

This petition started originally as a referral from the City Commission to the Public Works Committee. After Public Works Committee recommendations were reported back to the City Commission, the item was referred to the Community Development Committee for further discussion and recommendations. The proposed changes to the text are as follows:

## 30-332. Required number of parking spaces.

(g) Reduction in number of required parking spaces. The development review board or city plan board, through development plan review, or staff, when only staff review is required, may authorize a reduction in the number of required vehicular parking spaces, if it is determined

there will be adequate access to the development by acceptable alternative means and that the reduction will not infringe upon the parking and access available to other properties in the area. In reaching a determination the board or staff shall be guided on the following criteria:

(1) Evidence that patrons and/or employees of the establishment will arrive by a transportation mode other than private vehicles....

Provided, however, the number of required parking spaces shall not be reduced for the erection, construction or placement of any building on any land; and provided, further, that the number of bicycle spaces in mixed use districts may be reduced using the same criteria as for vehicular spaces.

- (h) Reduction in number of required bicycle parking spaces. The development review board or city plan board, through development plan review, or staff, when only staff review is required, may authorize a reduction in the number of required bicycle parking spaces if it is determined there will be reason to anticipate a lesser need for bicycle parking. In no instance shall the number of required bicycle parking spaces be reduced to less than 50 percent of the requirement. In reaching a determination of reduction in the number of bicycle parking spaces the board or staff shall apply the following criteria, as applicable:
  - (1) Evidence that there is an adequate number of bicycle parking spaces in the vicinity (within 100 feet of the development) that are available to the general public and that said use will not reduce the spaces available to and used by other establishments.
  - (2) Evidence that the proposed use(s) and likely future uses of the development will generate less bicycle parking than is otherwise required by this chapter.
  - (3) Evidence that a reduction in required bicycle parking will not result in unauthorized use of pedestrian areas for bicycle parking or in unauthorized use of bicycle parking provided by nearby businesses.
  - (4) Evidence that bicycle parking and/or bicycle storage space is available for employees and the general public within a building or structure on the development site.

## 11. Petition 82TCH-04 PB

City Plan Board. Amend Sec. 30-332 to add language allowing a reduction in the number of required bicycle parking spaces.

Mr. Jason Simmons indicated that the proposed text change was to allow a bicycle parking reduction option. He explained that City Commissioners had expressed some concern about bicycle parking requirements for certain uses in remote locations. He noted that there was an option for requesting a reduction in automobile parking, but no option for bicycle parking. Mr. Simmons indicated that the matter was referred to the Public Works and Committee Development Committees, where there were concerns that the parking might be reduce past a certain point. He explained that the recommendation was that in no instance should the required bicycle parking be reduced to less than 50 percent of the required amount. He offered to answer questions from board.

Mr. Reiskind asked if the planning staff modified the wording recommended by the Community Development Committee.

Mr. Simmons indicated that the bulk of the new text was recommended by the Public Works Committee, and was then forwarded to the City Commission, who referred it back to the Community Development Committee. He noted that the Community Development Committee recommended the language, "in no instance shall the number of spaces be reduced to less than 50-percent."

Mr. Reiskind asked if the Bicycle Pedestrian Advisory Board had reviewed the proposed modifications, and were in attendance at the Community Development Committee meetings.

Mr. Simmons indicated that the Pedestrian Bicycle Board was aware of the proposed changes.

There was no public comment on the petition.
