City Commission Referral

- May 7, 2015 CityCom Meeting (Leg Item #140680)
- Develop a General Government managed water/wastewater connection program
- Re-establish funding by re-instituting 25% unincorporated area (effective Oct 1, 2015) surcharge on new W/WW connections in
- Entire surcharge revenue to go to ConnectFree
- Twice the historical level (previously ½ of surcharge
- Estimated revenue \$250,000/year



City Commission Referral

- Open up eligibility to GRU service territory
- Refer issue to Community Development Committee for further discussion & recommendations



BRFA Committee

- Base Rate & Fuel Adjustment Committee Report (March 5, 2015) recommendations:
- Create dedicated funding source
- Put program under general govt control
- Focus on low income residents, feasible locations, dense population & possibly nonprofits that offer significant public benefit
- Develop criteria for non-profits
- Discuss per customer cap & annual evaluation of cap




Program Focus

- Water/Wastewater Extensions
- Reclaimed Water (lower priority)
- Feasible locations in densely populated low-income areas
- Priority given to units with health, safety and/or environmental issues
- Based on Cost Effectiveness/Efficiency

Eligible Properties (Existing Buildings)

Residential (Existing):

- Owner-Occupied Units
- Rental Units

Non-Residential (Existing):

- Non-Profit Organizations or Government Entities
- Used primarily for charitable services to benefit special needs populations in the community:
- Special Needs Population include, but are not limited to: the history of chemical dependency. violence; mentally disabled persons; and/or individuals with a persons with HIV/AIDS; at-risk youth; survivors of domestic elderly; physically disabled persons; homeless persons, veterans,

Items Associated w/Connections

- Water & Wastewater Extensions
- Connection Fees
- On-Site Plumbing Modifications



Water & Wastewater Extensions

- Extend lines to owner's property boundary
- Costs vary, determined by engineering analysis
- Maximum proposed spending caps:

Water Extensions

\$10,000

Wastewater Extensions

\$25,000

Some restrictions apply:

- Property owners required to pay extension costs exceeding the maximum funding cap
- Exceptions on case-by-case basis, subject to City Manager or designee approval



Connection Fees (FY 2016)

• Water Connections:

\$1,756

Wastewater Connections:

\$3,935

Connect Free Program will pay connection fees

Connect Free Program will pay 25% surcharge fee, if applicable

Fees adjusted annually with CCOM approval



On-Site Plumbing

- Installation of plumbing to connect services to central water/wastewater systems
- Well Abandonment or Backflow Preventer
- Septic Tank Abandonment
- Typically \$400-\$700 water; \$1,200-\$1,500
- Property owners required to pay for on-site plumbing modifications
- Exception: program will pay the on-site plumbing costs for income eligible households up to (TBD)% Median Family Income

Option 1: Grant

Assistance provided in the form of a grant and not subject to recapture.

Option 2: Deferred Payment Loan

Assistance provided in the form of a deferred loan and subject to recapture.

Wells

Not meeting primary drinking water standards

Septic Tanks

- Threat to human health
- Impact to waterway

Partner with Health Dept. to assist with assessment



Application Process

Open Enrollment

First Ready/First Served

- Tiers 1 and 2
- Tier 3 (Waiting List)

Mid-Year Assessment (April)

- Evaluate program to determine whether to offer services to Tier 3
- Provide status reports to CCOM, as needed
- Notify CCOM of projects over \$100k

Single Unit vs. Neighborhood Extensions

Single Unit

- Individual owner that is near existing water or sewer line
- Extension cost subject to caps

Neighborhood

- Requires longer extension
- Extension cost subject to "cumulative" cap
- Typically not everyone will agree to connect





Neighborhood Extensions

- Extensions to serve more than 1 property must meet ONE of these criteria:
- 1. The cost per participating home is within the per lot cap (\$10,000 Water; \$25,000 Wastewater)

O R

The cost per potentially served home is within served lots are participating the per lot cap AND 60% of the potentially







Annual Program Budget (Estimated-\$250,000)

- Public Health/Safety/Environmental (10%) (min. \$25,000)
- Single Units/Neighborhood Extensions (60%) (\$150,000)
- Owner Occupied, Rental & Non-Profits
- Individual properties requesting extensions
- Affordable Housing Set-Aside (15%) (\$37,500)
- Program Delivery (15%) (min. \$37,500)
- Administration, Marketing/Advertising, Reporting, etc.

*City Manager or designee may reallocate funds based on program needs.



Summary

- Water/Wastewater Extensions
- Reclaimed Water lower priority
- Priority given to densely populated low-income areas & to health, safety and/or environmental issues
- Caps on extension costs (\$10k water; \$25k sewer)
- Eligible to property owners within GRU Service Area
- Open Enrollment
- Tiers 1 and 2 First Ready/First Served
- Tier 3 Waiting List/Mid Year Evaluation
- CCOM notification for projects over \$100K
- City Mgr or designee reallocate funds based on needs
- Program review/evaluation to CCOM within 18 months
