19	period of 14 or more days in the aggregate during any calendar year and which is not the person'
20	permanent address, or a place where the person routinely abides, lodges or resides for a period or
21	four or more consecutive or nonconsecutive days in any month and which is not the person's

permanent address.

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1	Section 2. It is the intention of the City Commission that Section 1 of this ordinance shall
2	become and be made a part of the Gainesville Code of Ordinance, of the City of Gainesville,
3	Florida, and that the Sections and Paragraphs of this ordinance may be renumbered or relettered in
4	order to accomplish such intentions.
5	Section 3. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is held to be invalid or
6	unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, then said holding shall in no way affect the
7	validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.
8	Section 4. All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, in conflict herewith are to the extent of
9	such conflict hereby repealed.
10	Section 5. This ordinance shall become effective immediately on adoption
