## "A County-wide Visioning and Planning Opportunity"

<u>Purpose</u>: To create tools that will enable communities to take the lead in annexation and development issues. These tools include:

- A County-wide vision of future growth that protects unique local characteristics and home rule authority,
- Coordinated service transition between governments,
- Joint planning agreements that insure compatible and desirable land uses, and
- A streamlined and predictable comprehensive planning amendment and implementation process.

<u>Timeline and Costs</u>: The County-wide visioning and planning process is expected to take two years. The Steering Committee is asking each municipality and the County to contribute to the cost of the project based upon \$1 per resident. Other sources of funding, such as State and Federal grants, will also be sought.

Benefits: The results of this joint effort will include:

- The creation of a *Process and Framework* for the improvement and simplification of the annexation process.
- The basis for *Collaboration and Cooperation* between the municipalities, and between the municipalities and the County with respect to development issues, and
- The development of a mutually shared *Vision for Future Growth*.



WHEREAS, in January 2001, elected and appointed officials from all of the county's municipalities, the school board, regional agencies and citizens convened to discuss issues of mutual concern including the Boundary Adjustment Act (BAA), annexation and joint planning; and

WHEREAS, after much deliberation and discussion, the Alachua County/Municipal Leaders Steering Committee recommended pursuing a County-wide Visioning and Planning Opportunity that would emphasize each community's vison statement and area plans, which would be consistent and compatible with the plans of other communities and the County, thereby fostering a greater understanding of each community's values and characteristics as they relate to future growth; and
